Over the last 13 years, crime in the City of Peru dropped to a new low representing a 60.9% drop in crime during this period.

For this reason, while we pause to acknowledge the significant progress made to date, we remain vigilant, as our mission remains a work in progress. This is especially noteworthy as the jurisdictional responsibilities has increased and in 2018 the Peru Police Department handled a record number of calls for service and officer initiated activities totalling 30,703. The Peru Police Department is one of the busiest police agencies in North Central Illinois and at the same time enjoys one of the lowest crime rates.

We value a police/community partnership as the responsible approach to maintaining social order and controlling crime.

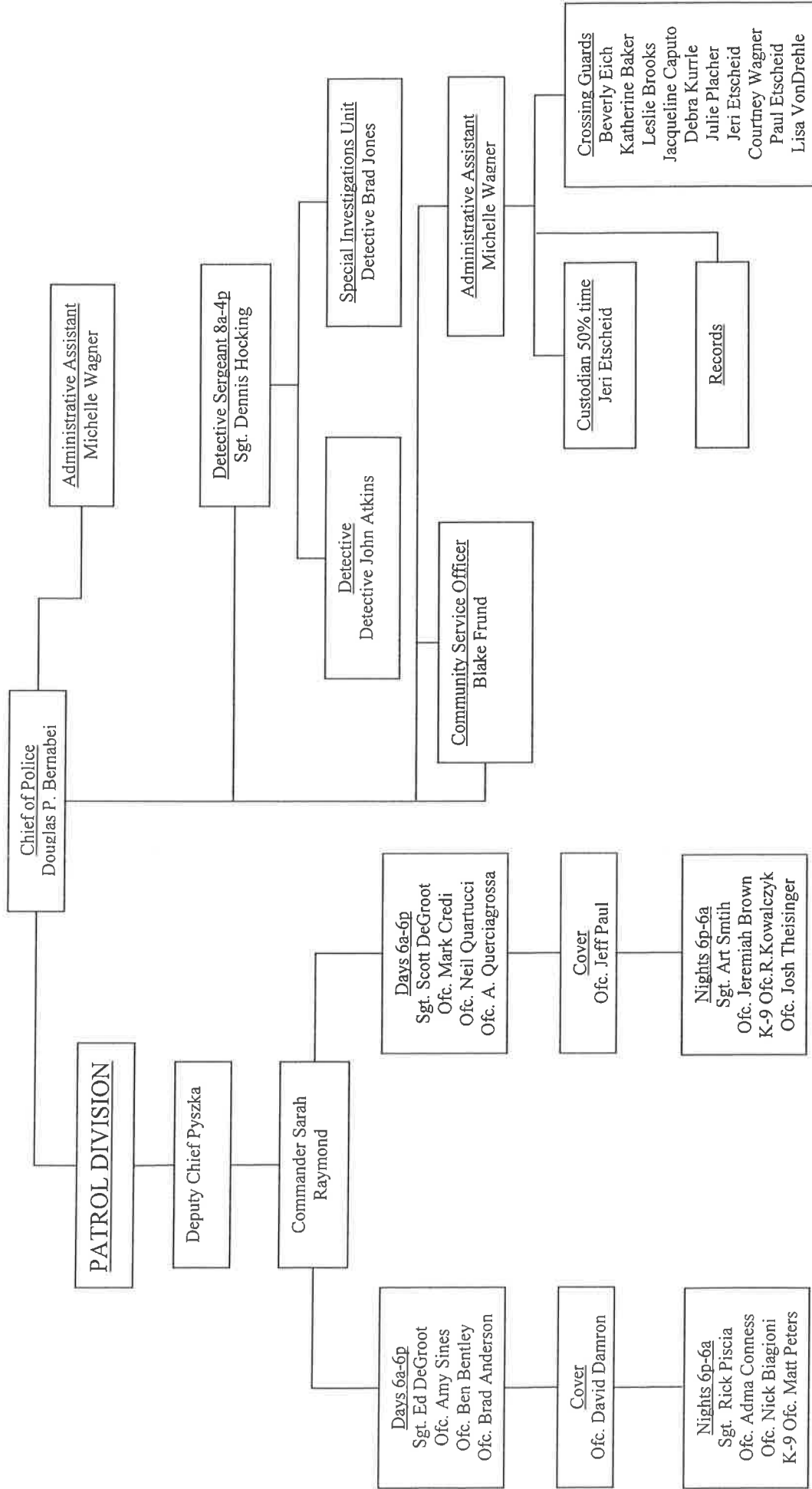
