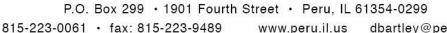

A regular meeting of the Peru City Council was called to order by Mayor Scott J. Harl in the Peru City Council Chambers on Monday, October 14, 2019 at 7:04 p.m.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Ballard and Buffo present; Aldermen Radtke, Sapienza and Payton absent, Mayor Harl present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

PUBLIC COMMENT

PRESENTATION

Ms. Verbal Blakey of BHMG Engineers, Inc. addressed the council to discuss plans to repair or replace Water Street Substation. Mr. Jason Jackson of BHMG Engineers, Inc. stated the transformers and breakers are the cause for us looking into this. Mr. Jackson stated it is functional now but it is very tight on space. Mr. Jackson noted the transformer is a need and the next step is to choose space opportunities and recommended an engineering scope for both sites. Ms. Blakey laid out two options; the first would be to replace the substation transformers with a new unit, adjust cables, install new switchgear and install more flood protection to avoid damage from the Illinois River. Those improvements would take about 14-16 months and cost an estimated \$3 million and the second option would be to design and install an entirely new substation in a different area outside of the flood plain. The design phase would take a little longer for this project since they would have to find a new location. Ms. Blakey stated the total project time frame would be 16-20 months at an estimated cost of \$4.5 million. Ms. Blakey stated replacing parts at the current substation could prove problematic since the city would be retrofitting new parts into old equipment. Ms. Blakey stated the substation was initially built in the 1960s and it is not safe to go and do maintenance on it. Council agreed to let BHMG move forward on more exact cost estimates for both options. In the meantime, the city will be considering options for a new location for the substation that would be located outside of the floodplain. Alderman Lukosus stated we may need a little time to see what the options are on where we can move it.

The Council and Alderman Lukosus asked about benefits of additional space. Ms. Blakey recommended alternate locations for safety of operations and future flexibility for growth.

Ms. Blakey explained the probability that the scope of expense would be more volatile at the existing site.

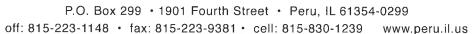

Attached for your information is the building permit report. There were eighty-five (85) building permits issued during the Third Quarter period ending September 30, 2019.

The total construction costs permitted were \$2,103,684.04. Permit fees in the amount of \$6,605.39 were charged and collected. In this quarter, twelve (12) commercial renovation permits and twelve (12) home remodeling permits were issued. Inspection and other fees of \$4,165.00 were collected.

For the same period in 2018 there were a total of ninety (90) permits issued including eleven (11) commercial renovation permits and six (6) home remodeling permits. The total construction costs for the same period were \$2,715,300.00.

Accordingly, I have deposited the total collected fees of \$10,770.39 with the City Clerk for the Third Quarter 2019 Building Permits.

DERGANCE, husband and wife, of the City of Peru, IL (hereinafter "Grantors"), for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and other good and valuable considerations, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey to the CITY OF PERU, ILLINOIS, an Illinois municipal corporation, its successors, permittees, and assigns (hereinafter "Grantee") the following perpetual rights and easements:

To construct, operate, repair, maintain, patrol, inspect, relocate, reconstruct, and remove from time to time sanitary sewers, storm sewers, water mains and lines and any and all necessary manholes, tiles, fire hydrants, pipes, connections, buffalo boxes, and, without limitation, such other installations as may be required or may be deemed necessary by Grantee for water service, sanitary and/or storm sewer purposes,

in, over, under, across, along, and upon the real estate described and depicted in attached "Exhibit A" (hereinafter "Easement Tract").

The aforesaid perpetual rights and easements are granted together with the right (i) to use adjacent roads, streets, and alleys for such purposes and to use reasonable working space adjacent to said Easement Tract during construction or maintenance of said utility systems; (ii) to control the growth of any vegetation, trees, shrubs, or saplings on the Easement Tract; and (iii) to clear and remove, without any liability whatsoever to Grantee, any obstacles on the Easement Tract which interfere or threaten to interfere with the safe and proper construction, operation, and maintenance of any said utility systems on the Easement Tract, or which create hazardous conditions, and to keep the Easement Tract clear of such obstacles and obstructions. 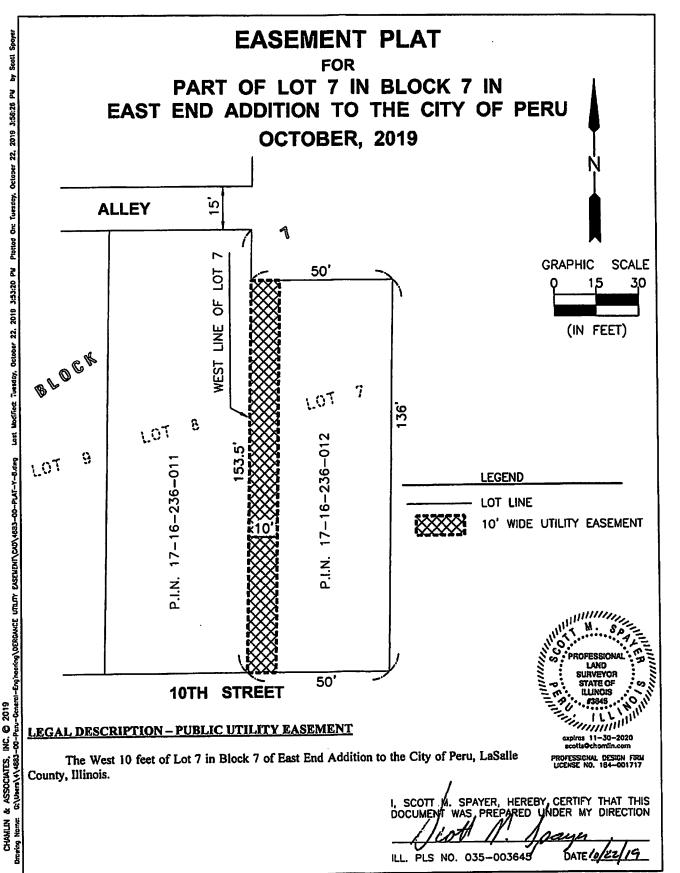

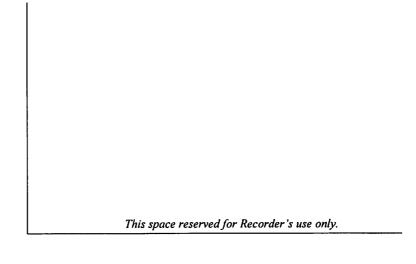

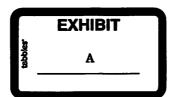

THIS ASSIGNMENT AND FIRST AMENDMENT TO SALE OF PROPERY AND REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT (this "Assignment and Amendment") is entered into as of the ______ day of ______, 2019, (the "Assignment Effective Date") by and between the CITY OF PERU, an Illinois home-rule municipal corporation (the "City"); SIDLYD INVESTMENTS, LLC, a Florida limited liability company ("SIDLYD INVESTMENTS"); and SIDLYD SPR PARTNERS, LLC, a Florida limited liability company ("SIDLYD PARTNERS").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City and SIDLYD INVESTMENTS entered into a Sale of Property and Redevelopment Agreement (hereinafter "Agreement") on June 24, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the City and SIDLYD INVESTMENTS have agreed, pursuant to Section 17C. of the Agreement, to amend the Agreement to extend certain deadlines due to unanticipated delays; and

WHEREAS, SIDLYD INVESTMENTS wishes to assign its rights and obligations under the Agreement to SIDLYD PARTNERS; and

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto desire to evidence such assignment and amendment to the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals, the covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. <u>Assignment and Assumption</u>. Except as modified by this Assignment and Amendment, all terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

FEASIBILITY STUDY AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into at St. Louis, Missouri this 26th day of September 2019 by and between The **CITY OF PERU**, **IL** hereinafter referred to as "the Owner" and COUNSILMAN-HUNSAKER, a Missouri corporation, doing business at 10733 Sunset Office Drive, Suite 400, St. Louis, Missouri 63127-1018, hereinafter referred to as "the Consultant".

WHEREAS, The **CITY OF PERU, IL** is undertaking a Feasibility Study Plan for the construction, operation and maintenance of a public swimming pool,

WHEREAS, the Consultant is a consultant in the field of swimming pool complex planning and design, and

WHEREAS, The **CITY OF PERU, IL** is desirous of retaining the Consultant as its independent contractor for purposes of planning the aquatic center.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I. SERVICES.

The **CITY OF PERU**, **IL** hereby retains the Consultant as its aquatic planning and design consultant for the proposed project. The scope of the Consultant's services are:

1. NEEDS ANALYSIS: (1 trip)

- A. Meet with the steering committee, plus any designated community groups and/or individuals involved in the project to analyze needs and determine objectives. The Consultant will conduct individual interviews as necessary in order to ascertain existing levels of service and the perceived needs of various user groups in the community.
- B. In addition to individual meetings, The Consultant will participate in a public or by invitation civic meeting to discuss the various issues concerning the proposed facility. This discussion will include images and/or video presentations with commentary on features of other aquatic centers similar to that being considered for this project, background information on historic and contemporary issues in the industry, and an open-forum question-and-answer session to discuss concerns and needs of those individuals and groups attending the meeting. A matrix of programming priorities will be developed and discussed to prioritize programming and facility features. The Consultant will use the results of the interviews and public workshop to develop a needs profile.
- C. Conduct research and compile demographic information necessary to appropriately evaluate the proposed facility, including population, age distribution, income, weather analysis and economic considerations that could affect the project's viability.

- D. Prepare and submit an outline of a Design Program of spaces and features for the proposed aquatic center describing the swimming pool, pool size, shape and support spaces based on preliminary discussions and meetings noted above.
- E. Based on the first meeting and committee's review of the outline program, develop with the Owner a Design Program for the swimming pool with recommendations on the size and shape of the pool(s) as well as architectural and engineering features of the building and support spaces. The Design Program will address the following items:
 - 1. Pool (or pools) or Spaces Design: Size, Depth, Configuration, Water Features, etc.
 - 2. User Populations and Programs to be Supported
 - 3. Lighting
 - 4. Pool Markings
 - 5. Traffic Patterns
 - 6. Deck Equipment
 - 7. Underwater Features
 - 8. Mechanical Features, Filter System Options, Water Treatment and Automatic Water Treatment Control
 - 9. Spectator Facilities
 - 10. Dressing Room Features and User Spaces

2. <u>CONCEPTUAL PLAN:</u> (1 trip)

- A. Based on the agreed upon program, the Consultant will prepare two concepts for an outdoor aquatic center located at Washington Park, adjacent to the existing Splash Field.
- B. The Consultant will provide a conceptual plan of each option. The purpose of the plans will be to illustrate ways to organize the spaces in a functional arrangement and to confirm that the facility footprint will contain the areas proposed in the Design Program.
- C. The Consultant will meet a second time with the committee to participate in a design workshop. Preliminary concepts and program features will be reviewed and confirmed. A public meeting may or may not be held as a part of this visit.
- D. Following the meeting, the Consultant will make revisions to the selected plan and send it to the Committee.

3. <u>COST ANALYSIS:</u> (1 trip)

A. The Consultant will prepare an Opinion of Probable Construction Cost for the pool(s) and building. Recent project bid figures of similar projects will be used as well as national estimating guides and local cost adjustment factors. The hard **construction cost** figures will be supplemented by a development cost factor, which

will include such "soft" costs as professional fees, survey, geotechnical report, document reproduction, advertisement for bids and all anticipated expenses related to the administration of the project. The sum of these two cost figures will be the **total project cost** so that the City will have a comprehensive overview before making an informed decision about the project.

- B. The Consultant will prepare a Feasibility Study and will develop an opinion of operations protocol for the proposed project. The following will be researched and analyzed:
 - 1. Operational data for the public swimming pool including attendance projections and trends, admission and pricing structure, aquatic program offerings, projected revenue, operating expenses, net operating income and net income after capital costs.
 - 2. Analysis of market demographics including population levels and trends, incomes, and age distribution.
 - 3. A review of local school year schedules.
 - 4. A review of competing aquatic facilities in the area.
 - 5. Projections of design level attendance figures and required capacity requirements.
 - 6. Projections of facility operational expenses including, personnel, chemical demand, operating supplies, maintenance and repair, utility demand, marketing, and food and beverage.
 - 7. Projections of overall financial performance for the swimming pool.
- C. The Consultant will make a final presentation to the project committee outlining the methods and results of the study.

II. DRAWINGS.

Except for reference and coordination purposes in connection with future additions or alterations to the work, drawings, specifications and other documents prepared by Counsilman-Hunsaker are instruments of the service for use solely with respect to this project and, unless otherwise provided, Counsilman-Hunsaker shall be deemed the author of these documents and shall retain all common law, statutory and other reserved rights, including copyright. The Consultant's drawings, specifications or their documents shall not be used by the City or others on other projects except by agreement in writing and with appropriate compensation to the Consultant. The City shall be permitted to retain copies, including reproducible copies of the reports.

III. FEES.

Total fees shall be \$22,000 including two (2) site visits and inclusive of related travel expenses.

The Consultant shall submit monthly invoices for services based upon the percentage of the Consultant's services completed at the time of billing. City shall make payments to Consultant within forty-five (45) days of the invoice date. If payment is not received with forty-five days (45) from the invoice date, interest will begin to accrue from the date of the invoice at the rate of 1.5% per month. Consultant may, after giving seven (7) days written notice to the City, suspend services until payment is made in full of all past due invoices for this project.

The Consultant shall submit monthly statements of basic and additional services and for reimbursable expense incurred, based upon the Consultant's hourly rate schedule for services completed at the time of billing. City shall make payment within thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice from Counsilman-Hunsaker. If City fails to make any payment due Consultant for services and expenses within forty-five (45) days after receipt of invoice, Consultant may, after giving seven (7) days written notice to the City, suspend services under his Agreement until payment in full of amounts due Consultant for services and expenses have been paid.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, and notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, the total liability, in the aggregate, of Counsilman-Hunsaker and Counsilman-Hunsaker's officers, directors, partners, employees, agents and Counsilman-Hunsaker's Consultants, and any of them, to CITY and anyone claiming by, through or under CITY for any and all claims, losses, costs, or damages whatsoever arising out of, resulting from, or in a any way related to the conclusions and recommendations expressed in the Feasibility Study shall not exceed the total compensation received by Counsilman-Hunsaker under this Agreement.

IV. TERMINATION:

Each party agrees that upon the occurrence of a material breach or default of the other under the terms of this Agreement, it shall provide written notice of such default to the other. Such written notification given by the party shall specifically state the material breach or default under the terms of this Agreement. The notified party shall have thirty (30) days after such notice is given to remedy the specific breach or default. Upon the failure by the defaulting party to cure the specified breach or default within the allotted time, or recurrence of the same breach within thirty (30) days after its initial cure, the other party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement except with respect to any liabilities or obligations which, under the terms of this Agreement are to survive its termination.

V. SCHEDULE OF WORK:

The Consultant shall execute all of the tasks listed above within 120 calendar days of receipt of a signed agreement and authorization to proceed. Review periods by the City, postponement of

meetings, submittal of City information or other delays not caused by the Consultant, will be added to the 120 calendar days.

VI. <u>ENTIRE AGREEME</u>NT:

This agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the parties and cannot be modified except by their mutual written consent. In the event of a conflict between his Agreement and the terms of any other agreement or document pertaining to the Project, the terms and provisions of this Agreement will be controlling.
