



A regular meeting of the Peru City Council was called to order by Mayor Scott J. Harl in the Peru City Council Chambers on Monday, September 16, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Ballard and Buffo present; Alderman Payton absent, Mayor Harl present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

PUBLIC COMMENT

PRESENTATION

Mayor Harl presented Eagle Scouts Christian Risk, Colton Sittler, Carson Vaske and Joseph Vlastnik the City of Peru Good Neighbor Recognition for their work on community projects as part of their quest to achieve the eagle scout ranking.

Mr. Steve Aubry of North Central Illinois Development Corporation introduced the new President and CEO Mr. Mike Kirchhoff to the council. Mr. Kirchhoff provided his economic development background as follows:

- 30 years of experience
- Worked for DECA and Ameren
- Multiple positions in economic development

Mayor Harl introduced Mr. Luke Tomsha of The Perfectly Flawed Foundation. Mr. Tomsha thanked the City supporting the Back to School Bash in which 500 youth were served. Mr. Tomsha provided information regarding the foundation:

Alderman Waldorf seconded the motion. City Engineer Eric Carls stated the fees would be percentage based and phased in. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Payton absent; motion carried.

Alderman Ballard made a motion to execute an Engineering Service Agreement with Chamlin & Associates for the extension of Midtown Road west from N. Peoria St. Alderman Lukosus seconded the motion. City Engineer Eric Carls stated the fees would be percentage based and phased in. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Payton absent; motion carried.

Alderman Ferrari made a motion the minutes be received, placed on file and concur with the recommendation. Alderman Buffo seconded the motion; motion carried.

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert presented a proposed ordinance entitled:

AN AMENDING THE CITY OF PERU ZONING ORDINANCE PERTAINING TO ADULT-USE CANNABIS

Alderman Waldorf made a motion the ordinance be adopted as written and read. Alderman Sapienza seconded the motion. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert highlighted the following:

- B4 zoning for dispensaries (6 types)
- M2 zoning for cultivation centers (growers)
- All would require special use
- Most located north of Wenzel Road near I-80

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Payton absent; motion carried.

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert presented the minutes of a public hearing held on September 11, 2019 concerning the petition of James S. Happ and Susan J. Happ concerning property located at 902 14th Street, Peru, IL.

Alderman Ferrari made a motion the minutes be received, placed on file and concur with the recommendation. Alderman Buffo seconded the motion; motion carried.

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert presented a proposed ordinance entitled:

Alderman Ballard made a motion the ordinance be adopted as written and read. Alderman Ferrari seconded the motion. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Payton absent; motion carried.

Mayor Harl announced his proposal to allocate \$1,000,000 of reserves to alderman as a 10-year disc fund or \$25,000 per ward, per year. Mayor Harl stated it would be for select sidewalks and alleys or other miscellaneous items. Alderman Sapienza stated he was in favor of the proposed plan. City Engineer Eric Carls noted this is a supplemental program in addition to the primary road programs. Alderman Radtke stated he would like the Finance and Safety Services Committee to review financial options.

Mayor Harl reported the Electric Department has continued to voice concerns about transformers at the Water Street Substation. Mayor Harl stated BHMG will provide a proposal at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Harl reported on the RFP received regarding a pool feasibility study. Mayor Harl asked for a recommendation by the selected people to move forward with selected consultant. By straw poll, council agreed to move forward.

Alderman Lukosus made a motion to approve selected candidate for the position of Public Services Office Assistant. Alderman Sapienza seconded the motion. PSM/Fire Chief Jeff King reported four very qualified candidates were interviewed. PSM/Fire Chief King reported the candidate will be located at the Electric Department but will also work at the Public Works Department.

The Peru Volunteer Ambulance Service responded to two hundred sixty-two (262) patient/calls during the month of August. The two hundred sixty-two (262) patient/calls included one hundred thirty-eight (138) emergencies for Peru, five (5) emergencies for Dimmick, two (2) emergencies for Peru Township, and one hundred five (105) transfers. Of the one hundred forty-five (145) emergencies, eighty-five (85) patients were transported, forty-nine (49) patients refused treatment, seven (7) were disregarded, and four (4) were stand-bys.

Peru Volunteer Ambulance Service, Inc. responded to three (3) Mutual Aid requests with La Salle Ambulance, one (1) Mutual aid request with Utica Ambulance, one (1) Mutual Aid request with PC EMS, one (1) Mutual Aid request with Mendota, one (1) Intercept request with LaMoille Ambulance, and five (5) Motor Cross stand-bys.

The total mileage logged was 12523 miles for the month of August.

Mr. Kowalczyk:

This is a revision to Layne's August 7, 2019 Well 9 pump repair estimate. Since that date, the pump's 500 MCM cable was reevaluated with a HyPot test after a splice and 45' of cable were removed. The cable still failed the test. A copy of the test results are attached for your records.

The Well 9 pump was removed due to low capacity. A large hole was found in the column pipe just below the surge control. The column threads above the stainless bowl nipple were also washed out. As you are aware, several column joints required torch cutting to remove from the well. The interior of the column pipe was heavily encrusted with deposition and required extra efforts to remove prior to pipe inspection.

Based upon the recommendations of Layne's July 31, 2019 Pump Inspection Report, and our discussions since, total project estimate is as follows:

SECTION 1: The Mayor, for and on behalf of the City, is hereby authorized and directed to execute, and the City Clerk, for and on behalf of the City, is hereby authorized and directed to attest, Acceptance of Easement from U.S. Silica, a copy of which Easement is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

To construct, operate, repair, maintain, patrol, inspect, relocate, reconstruct, and remove from time to time an underground lift station and associated sanitary sewer and electrical service lines, manholes, tiles, pipes, connections, and, without limitation, such other installations as may be required or may be deemed necessary by Grantee for sanitary and/or storm sewer purposes

within the Easement Tract described and depicted in "Exhibit A" attached hereto (hereinaster "Easement Tract").

Grantor reserves the right to make any use of the Easement Tract so long as such use does not interfere with the rights herein granted or create a hazardous condition, except that Grantor shall make no excavations on the Easement Tract without the prior written consent of the Grantee, and then only in such manner as will not disturb or interfere with the Grantee's facilities located therein, nor shall Grantor place buildings or structures on the Easement Tract.

Grantor hereby releases and waives all rights under and by virtue of the homestead exemption laws of the State of Illinois. This Easement shall run with the land and shall be binding upon the parties hereto, their respective heirs, successors, administrators, and assigns.



Pursuant to legal notice published in the News Tribune in the manner provided by law, the Planning/Zoning Commission of the City of Peru, IL (hereinafter "City") convened for a public hearing on Wednesday, September 24, 2019, at 5:00 p.m. in the City Municipal Building, 1901 Fourth Street, Peru, IL, to consider the Petition of Kathleen M. Budnick (hereinafter "Petitioner") praying for a variance under the terms of the Zoning Ordinance of the City as it applies to the real estate located at 1803 JoAnn Drive, Peru, IL (hereinafter the "Premises"), legally described as follows:

Lot Thirty-Seven (37) in Mertel's Evergreen Park Subdivision in the City of Peru, according to the Plat thereof recorded May 3, 1957 in Plat Book "V", Page 40 as Doc. #335670, situated in LaSalle County, Illinois (hereinafter "Property")

The Petitioner desires to install a privacy and security fence to increase curb appeal, define the yard, and increase safety for the future, and seeks a variance to reduce the south side yard setback abutting a street from not less than thirty feet (30') as required under Section 10.03(h)(2)b.i of the Zoning Ordinance to zero feet (0').

The Premises is located within an R-2 Single Family Detached Residence District.

Planning/Zoning Members Miller, Grabowski, Lucas, Brady, and Moreno were present at the hearing. Members Atkinson and Kalsto were absent.

Petitioner, after first being duly sworn, testified that she has two young boys and a dog and desires to enclose her backyard with a white privacy fence. She requires a variance for the side yard abutting 14th Street.

In response to questioning from Member Lucas, Petitioner stated that she found the pins and identified her property lines. In response to further questioning from Member Brady, Petitioner stated that there is presently a shed located on the south property line in the back yard. Petitioner plans to construct the fence along the south property line with the shed acting as part of the fence.

In response to questioning from Member Lucas, Petitioner testified that the proposed fence would have two access gates. A single gate will be on the south side of the fence and a double gate on the north side.

In response to questioning to Chairman Miller, Petitioner stated the fence would be a white privacy fence similar to what many other residents in the area have.

In response to member Lucas, Petitioner confirmed she had spoken with her neighbors and they have no objection to the proposed fence. Chairman Miller noted that the prior owner of the Premises may have had a fence there in the past.

No objectors were present at the hearing.

The Planning/Zoning Commission found that the requested variance, if granted, will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood; the granting of the variances will not be detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood; the proposed variance will not create any traffic visibility hazard; and the proposed variances will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent properties or substantially increase the congestion in the public streets or increase the danger of fire or endanger the public safety, or diminish or impair property values within the neighborhood.

Planning/Zoning Commission Member Grabowski moved and Planning/Zoning Commission Member Moreno seconded that the requested variance be favorably recommended to the City Council. The motion passed unanimously, 5 aye, 0 nay and 2 members absent.

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 74 – PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE II. - SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS, OF THE CITY OF PERU CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION OF THE PARKS, RECREATION, AND SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Peru ("City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution, 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that it is advisable and in the best interests of the City that Chapter 74 – Parks and Recreation, Article II. – Superintendent of Parks, be amended to provide for the creation of the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERU, LASALLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Chapter 74, Article II. – Superintendent of Parks, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Peru, Illinois shall be, and is hereby, amended and replaced in its entirety to read as follows:

ARTICLE II. - PARKS, RECREATION, AND SPECIAL EVENTS DEPARTMENT

Sec. 74-36. - Department Established.

There is hereby established in the City the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department.

Sec. 74-37. - Composition.

The Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department shall consist of a Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events and such other full- and part-time personnel as may be approved from time to time by the Mayor and City Council.

Sec. 74-38. - Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events; Duties.

- (a) There is hereby established the position of Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events. The Director shall be an employee of the City appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council and shall report to the Mayor.
- (b) The Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events shall have the following duties:
 - (1) Supervising and managing the day-to-day operations of the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department and its employees.
 - (2) Being directly responsible to the Mayor for the effective administration of the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department and all its activities.
 - (3) Staying informed as to the latest practices in the field of parks and recreation and, with the approval of the Mayor, implementing such new practices as they appear to be of benefit to the City and to the public.
 - (4) Submitting reports of the activities of the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department to the Mayor in a manner and form as requested.
 - (5) Subject to general regulations, requirements and policies promulgated by the City and when authorized by the Mayor, appointing and removing all employees assigned to the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department.
 - (6) Being responsible for the proper maintenance of all City property and equipment assigned to the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department.
 - (7) Planning, promoting, marketing, coordinating, evaluating and implementing City recreational programs and special event.
 - (8) Communicating with the public about City recreational programs and special events and registering program participants.
 - (9) Ensuring compliance with all applicable City regulations and ordinances and ensuring all necessary safety procedures are established, communicated, and followed by participants of City recreational programs and special events.
 - (10) Researching and making recommendations as to new community event programs.

- (11) Coordinating, preparing or organizing the preparation of City parks, rooms, fields, and other facilities where recreation programs and special events are held.
- (12) Ordering and maintaining inventory of materials and equipment needed for all City recreation programs and special events.
- (13) Cooperating with other departments and furnishing, upon direction of the Mayor, such service, labor and materials to other departments as shall be required for the efficient conduct of City affairs.
- (14) Cooperating with the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board to identify and address issues pertaining to the City's parks and recreation programs and facilities, and implementing improvements.
- (15) Preparing and proposing an annual budget for the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department in coordination with the City Finance Officer.

Sec. 74-39. - Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department Employees.

The Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department shall have such additional fulland part-time employees as the Mayor and City Council shall determine based on the recommendation of the Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events and the Human Resources Manager, the needs of the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department, and the financial resources of the City. The Mayor and City Council shall establish the terms and conditions of employment of such additional employees.

Sec. 74-40. - Budget.

The Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events, together with the City Finance Officer, shall be responsible for preparing and proposing an annual budget for the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department.

Sec. 74-41. - Expenditures; Solicitation and Receipt of Gifts, Bequests.

The Director of Parks, Recreation, and Special Events shall have the authority to spend such monies as shall be provided for the purposes established in this Article and in accordance with the City Purchasing Policy. The Director may also solicit and receive any gifts or bequests of money or other personal property or any donation, to be applied, principal and/or income, for either temporary or permanent use for parks, playgrounds, recreational centers, recreational facilities, recreational purposes, and/or City and community celebrations; provided, however, the total expenditures of such funds shall not exceed the annual sums budgeted therefore by the City Council.

Secs. 74-42 —74-65. - Reserved.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage and approval according to law. This ordinance shall be published in the Code of Ordinances, City of Peru, Illinois. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 74 – PARKS AND RECREATION, ARTICLE III. – PARKS AND RECREATION BOARD OF THE CITY OF PERU CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the City of Peru ("City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution, 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that it is advisable and in the best interests of the City that Chapter 74 – Parks and Recreation, Article III. – Parks and Recreation Board be amended to reflect changes in the name, duties, and responsibilities of Parks and Recreation Board as provided herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERU, LASALLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Chapter 74, Article III. - Parks and Recreation Board, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Peru, Illinois shall be, and is hereby, amended to read in its entirety as follows:

ARTICLE III. PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD SEC.74-66. CREATION, INTENT AND PURPOSE.

There is hereby created in the City a Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. It shall be the intent and purpose of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board to advise the City Council on matters relating to the administration, operation and conditions of recreation programs; to advise the City Council on matters relating to facilities, including the recreation buildings, splash pad, playgrounds, and other park facilities and equipment; to discuss and advise the City Council on issues referred to the Board by the City Council; and to assist the Director of the Parks, Recreation and Special Events

Department and other staff on developing and maintaining comprehensive recreation programs and opportunities for the City residents.

SEC. 74-67. COMPOSITION; APPOINTMENT

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall consist of seven (7) members who shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. Members serve at the discretion of the Mayor with the consent of the City Council and may be removed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council at any time.

SEC. 74-68. COMPENSATION

The members of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall serve without compensation.

SEC. 74-69. TERM OF OFFICE; VACANCIES

- (a) The term of office of members of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall be five (5) years or until respective successors are appointed and have qualified. The terms of the members of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall be staggered such that the term of one member shall expire annually.
- (b) Members must maintain a 2/3 attendance rate per year of regular meetings or they may be removed from the Board, to be reviewed by the Mayor and with the consent of the City Council. The Chairperson shall present with a yearly attendance report at the December Board Meeting (or if there is no December meeting, at the January Board meeting).

SEC. 74-70. DUTIES; MEETINGS; RULES OF PROCEDURE

- (a) The primary function of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall be to assist the City and the Parks, Recreation, and Special Events Department in the improvement of the City's park and recreation programs and facilities.
- (b) The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall meet no less than once per month to review matters pertaining to the City parks and recreation programs and facilities and to report and advise in writing on such matters to the City Council.
- (c) The Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall adopt its own rules of procedure and all meetings shall be held in accordance with such rules.
- (d) For purposes of conducting business, a majority of members duly appointed and serving as members shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 74-71. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Immediately after the appointment of the members of the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, the members shall meet and organize by electing one of its members Chairperson and such other officers as it may deem necessary.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage and approval according to law. This ordinance shall be published in the Code of Ordinances, City of Peru, Illinois.
