A regular meeting of the Peru City Council was called to order by Mayor Scott J. Harl in the Peru City Council Chambers on Monday, December 9, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo present; Mayor Harl present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

### MINUTES

Mayor Harl presented the minutes of the Regular Meeting of November 25, 2019. Alderman Waldorf made a motion that the minutes be received and placed on file. Alderman Ferrari seconded the motion; motion carried.

### FINANCIAL REPORTS

Mayor Harl presented the Treasurer's Report for October 2019, General Fund And Miscellaneous Funds Report for October 2019 and Utility Fund Report for October 2019. Alderman Radtke made a motion the reports be received and placed on file. Alderman Waldorf seconded the motion; motion carried.

### ACTIVITY REPORTS

Mayor Harl presented the Peru Police Department Monthly Report for November 2019. Alderman Lukosus made a motion the reports be received and placed on file. Alderman Ballard seconded the motion; motion carried.

Alderman Buffo made a motion that the report be received, placed on file and the bills be paid in the usual manner. Alderman Payton seconded the motion. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

Alderman Payton made a motion to approve MetLife proposal for 2020 & 2021 Dental Insurance with an annual premium of \$48,652. Two-year rate guarantee. Employees contribute 50% of premiums. Alderman Payton noted the slight decrease. Alderman Radtke seconded the motion. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

Alderman Payton made a motion to approve remaining with MetLife for group life insurance policy with an annual premium of \$7,089.54. Two-year rate guarantee. City pays 100% of premiums. Alderman Buffo seconded the motion. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

Alderman Radtke made a motion to waive the formal bid process due to previous state bid order cancellation and authorize the police chief to order a new police patrol vehicle (special service vehicle). Alderman Sapienza seconded the motion. ASM/Police Chief Doug Bernabei stated he typically uses the state bid program that was approved in September, but order was returned/cancelled due to volume of allocation. ASM/Chief Bernabei stated he shopped for alternatives and found a Dodge Durango police package. ASM/Police Chief Doug Bernabei stated the following:

- received two quotes
  - Coronet Dodge (under by \$1,500)
  - Taylorville dealership that does fleet sales
- Lower than Ford Explorer
- Asked to waive bid requirement (requires a 2/3 vote of the Council)

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

### PUBLIC SERVICES COMMITTEE

Alderman Waldorf made a motion to award the Midtown Road and 36<sup>th</sup> Street extension road base improvements to the lowest responsible bidder, John Pohar and Sons in the amount of \$779,706.00. City Engineer Eric Carls explained the motion required a super majority vote. Two contractors were prequalified due to season time constraints. The project consists of the extension of Midtown Road, the extension of 26<sup>th</sup> Street, and the creation of the north – south road to connect them. This project will tie in with the Peoria St work already underway and create the primary road bases with aggregate. Alderman Lukosus seconded the motion. City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

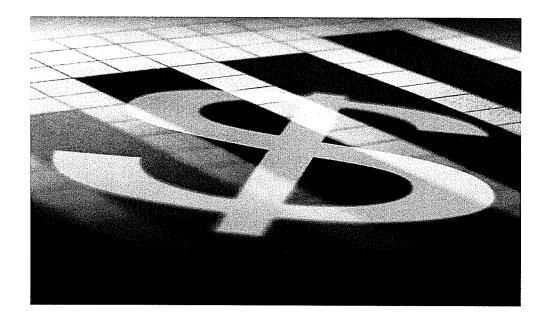

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 58 – LAW ENFORCEMENT, ARTICLE II. – POLICE DEPARTMENT, OF THE CITY OF PERU CODE OF ORDINANCES TO PROVIDE FOR PART-TIME POLICE OFFICERS

WHEREAS, the City of Peru (hereinafter "City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6, of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems it advisable and in the best interests of the City that

there be created part-time police officer positions.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE

### CITY OF PERU, LASALLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS

### FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Code Amendments. Chapter 58 - Law Enforcement, Article II. -

Police Department, of the City of Peru Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to add Section 58-

36. - Part-Time Police, which shall read as follows:

### Sec. 58-36. - Part-Time Police.

- (a) *Employment*. The City of Peru may employ part-time police officers from time to time as it deems necessary.
- (b) Duties. A part-time police officer shall have all the responsibilities of a fulltime police officer and such specific duties as delineated in the General Orders of the Peru Police Department, but the number of hours a part-time officer may work within a calendar year is restricted. Part-time police officers shall not be assigned to supervise or direct full-time police officers. Part-time police officers shall be trained in accordance with the Illinois Police Training Act (50 ILCS 705/1 et. seq.) and the rules and requirements of the Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board (ILETSB).

- (c) *Hiring Standards*. Any person employed as a part-time police officer must meet the following standards:
  - 1. Be of good moral character, of temperate habits, of sound health, and physically and mentally able to perform assigned duties.
  - 2. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
  - 3. Pass a medical examination.
  - 4. Possess a high school diploma or GED certificate.
  - 5. Possess a valid State of Illinois driver's license.
  - 6. Possess no prior felony convictions.
  - 7. Any individual who has served in the U.S. military must have been honorably discharged.
  - 8. Currently certified by ILETSB as a full or part-time police officer or currently enrolled in or to be sponsored in the part-time police academy.
- (d) Discipline. Part-time officers shall be under the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Chief of Police. Part-time police officers serve at the discretion of the City authorities, shall not have any property rights in said employment, and may be removed by the City authorities at any time. Part-time police officers shall comply with all applicable rules and General Orders issued by the Police Department.
- (e) *Hiring Authority*. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to employ part-time officers as needed to support departmental operations.

SECTION 2: Validity. If any section, paragraph, clause, phrase or part of this

ordinance is for any reason held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining

provisions of this ordinance, and the application of these provisions to any person or circumstances

shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 3: Conflicts. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the

provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.

**SECTION 4:** Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval according to law. This Ordinance shall be published in the City of Peru Code of Ordinances.

- (b) <u>Policy Application</u>. This Policy is not applicable to employees appointed by the City's Board of Fire and Police Commissioners, Department Heads appointed by the Mayor, or temporary/seasonal employees. This Policy is also not applicable to paid on-call Firefighters that fall within the staffing parameters of the Fire Department, which is 20 paid on-call and 3 cadet firefighters, or to part-time police officers authorized to work a specific number of hours per annum pursuant to the terms of the Illinois Fraternal Order of Police labor contract.

SECTION 2: Validity. If any section, paragraph, clause, phrase or part of this ordinance

is for any reason held invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions

of this ordinance, and the application of these provisions to any person or circumstances shall not be affected thereby.

Ordinance to provide compensation for part-time police officers.

CITY OF PERU, LASALLE COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1:** The Wage Ordinance shall be, and is hereby, amended to compensate parttime police officers as follows:

Police Department:	*Rates are Per Hour
Part-time sworn police officer in training	\$20.00
Part-time sworn police officer without certifications	Same hourly wage as a full-time sworn officer without certifications pursuant to FOP labor contract
Part-time sworn police officer with certifications	Same hourly wage as a full-time sworn officer with certifications pursuant to FOP labor contract

**SECTION 2:** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately from and after its passage and approval according to law.
