A special meeting of the Peru City Council was called to order by Mayor Scott J. Harl in the Peru City Council Chambers on Tuesday, March 17, 2020 at 6:30 p.m.

Mayor Harl read the title Guidance to Public Bodies on the Open Meetings Act and the Freedom of Information Act during the COVID-19 Pandemic as it pertains to waiving physical presence of a quorum of members of public body and allowing for remote access.

Requirement for a Physical Presence Quorum for Members of a Public Body OMA requires that a quorum of members of the public body be physically present at the meeting location and allows for limited circumstances in which remote access is acceptable. Executive Order 2020-07 suspends the in-person presence requirements and eliminates the limitation on remote access. If a meeting is necessary, public bodies are encouraged to utilize remote access as allowed by the Executive Order. Open and Convenient Meetings OMA requires public meetings to be "open and convenient" for members.

Additionally, the Order suspends the requirement of the Open Meetings Act requiring in-person attendance by members of a public body. The Governor has encouraged that public bodies postpone the consideration of public business when possible and to allow for a process for video, audio and/or telephonic access for members of the public when a meeting is necessary. You may wish to cancel all regular public meetings during the next two-week period. Emergency or special meetings could be called as needed. This is a local decision and should be made according to the best interests of your individual community.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Alderman Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus (present remotely), Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo (present remotely) present; Mayor Harl present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Harl reported the purpose of the special meeting is for the discussion and potential actio on an ordinance pertaining to Local State of Emergency and to address any matters that may come up in discussion related to COVID-19 and any and all matters related thereto.

PUBLIC COMMENT

REPORT OF CITY ATTORNEY/ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert presented a proposed ordinance entitled:

ORDINANCE NO. 6469

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 34-CIVIL EMERGENCIES, OF THE CITY OF PERU CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ADD ARTICLE III.-DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY

Mayor Harl stated there is not an emergency at this time and will just be an ordinance keeping up to date with the Illinois Municipal League (IML) along with stated and federal mandates and recommendations. Alderman Radtke stated it is his understanding this ordinance allows for the mayor to declare an emergency and take action for seven days or until the regular meeting essentially just bridging the time that we get together as a group and provide further direction. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated the ordinance would allow the mayor to have the authority to perform certain powers and functions and gives him the power to act quickly during this ever-changing situation. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated there was a meeting with attorneys from the cities of LaSalle, Oglesby, Spring Valley and Utica and all will be passing similar ordinances which from state statute that says by ordinance we can go ahead and provide when the mayor can declare an emergency and what actions he can take during an emergency and also wanted to mention the ordinance is only good for seven days and can be renewed. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated immediately upon declaration of emergency the mayor is to call for a special emergency meeting called within 24 hours if reasonably practical. Corporate Counsel stated if such meeting is called the council can adopt another ordinance that outlines exactly what powers or regulations are needed going forward. Mayor Harl asked if the 48-hour notice is relaxed during this time. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated there is a difference between special meeting and emergency meeting to where a 24-hour notice is suffice.

Alderman Ferrari asked about an emergency succession should the mayor be sick. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated the ordinance states the senior alderman would be in charge. Alderman Ferrari stated the proposed ordinance does not list city officials. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated the proposed ordinance amends ordinance number 4381 adopted in 2006 which lists city officials would be next in line to make decisions. Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert stated this ordinance gives power to hire temporary employees, temporary city officials and expend funds as necessary. Police Chief Doug Bernabei stated that if an emergency should be declared by the mayor then an COVID-19 ordinance would come before the council and that ordinance is being drafted as a precautionary measure. Alderman Waldorf made a motion the ordinance be adopted as written and read. Alderman Radtke seconded the motion. Clerk Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo voting aye; motion carried.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Alderman Ferrari, Waldorf, Lukosus, Radtke, Sapienza, Payton, Ballard and Buffo present; Mayor Harl present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Mayor Harl reported the purpose of the special meeting is for the discussion and potential action on a resolution pertaining to changes in staffing requirements and to address any matters that may come up in discussion related to COVID-19 and any and all matters related thereto.

Mayor Harl provided the following:

Timeline for 75% Reduction in Staff

Thursday, March 19, 2020 Myself and Staff assembled for Governor Pritzker news conference at 14:30 2:30PM scheduled time.

News conference starts a little late 14:40 2:40PM.

Conference over approximately 14:55 2:55PM

Discussion with staff and updates regarding one employee recently back from vacation and working from home with VPN (virtual private network) computer connected to city hall.

Two city hall employees called in with fever, off sick.

Further discussion with staff concerning the angst among their employees.

After further discussion and knowing the inevitable I made the decision to send employees home with pay, basically on call for the protection of not only our employees but for our residents as well. Some are able to work remotely with computers in their home and some are on call should an emergency arise.

We already issued the safe personal space rule for everyone which is extremely difficult in some situations. Example; water break and two men in an excavation fixing the break. Electric outage with two men in bucket. These are situations you can modify and work them out and our people have been doing just that.

With that being said, the obvious was coming like a freight train it just didn't happen at the Governor Pritzker press conference on Thursday, 19 March. With staff being 100% behind the decision to change the way we handle daily duties for our employees and residents; I made the decision to reduce the health threat to our valued employees and called for a 75% reduction in on site employees.

I made the decision at 15:15 3:15PM

Everyone from their respective departments went to work and drafted memos and press release. Memos were put together with multiple edits and sent to Elected and Staff at 16:38 4:38PM. From the time the decision was made until the time Elected and Staff had on their e-mails or paper in hand was <u>one hour and 23 minutes</u>. I am proud of the staff for working so diligently to put this important release together in this short amount of time.

This past week was filled with decision to be made and that will not subside anytime in the foreseeable future. More will arise and must be dealt with.

As you can imagine, I have received many calls and talked with many regarding this situation that is in front of us. I am in contact with many Mayoral colleagues from across the state to monitor their situation and them ours. The only difference in the City of Peru, it's Mayor and staff did on Thursday, 19 March was going to the reduction with pay 24 hours before many other communities, we should be proud.

As previously mentioned, many meetings took place the week of March 16th and I know many more will take place the week of March23rd. If we make it through today.

I took many calls, some good, some not so good, I have two that were like none other, the good news for me is, I now have clarity of the character of those two individuals, Thank you.

I have been in contact with owners of the GK Mall in Peru and given permission to use the Bergner's and Penney's building to be prepared for any contingencies. I have been in contact with the Kmart/Sears corporate real estate and gained full access to their facility on south end of Peru Mall as well.

One meeting that sticks out from the past week was this summary in terms everyone can understand. This requires a little thought. I have a pond that will be completely covered with lily pads on day 14; what day will the pond be half covered? CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

The different between normal day-to-day operations and emergency operations must be understood if emergency management is to be effective. During non-emergency periods, operational departments go about their daily business under direction of department heads or Chiefs. During a period of emergency or disaster the Mayor is held ultimately responsible for the preservation of life and protection of property, as outlined in Illinois state law. Department heads that previously provided direction to their forces continue to do so in time of emergency. During a major emergency or disaster situation however, department heads function and coordinate response from the Peru Emergency Operating Center (EOC) located as defined in Annex A2. Departments and agencies tasked with response and recovery missions, under this plan, make up the Peru Crisis Management Team (CMT). These departments and agencies include:





RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF 1224 PLAIN STREET, PERU, ILLINOIS
