CITY OF PERU PUBLIC HEARING MAY 26, 2020

Pursuant to legal notice published in the News Tribune in the manner provided by law, the City Council of the City of Peru convened for a Public Hearing on Tuesday, May 26, 2020, at 6:45 p.m. in the City Municipal Building, 1901 Fourth Street, Peru, IL, to provide the public with an opportunity to express their views on the proposed City application for a Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program grant funded by Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

Mayor Scott Harl, Alderman Tony Ferrari, Alderman Jim Lukosus, Alderman Mike Radtke, Alderman Tony Sapienza, Alderman Tom Payton, Alderman Jeff Ballard, and Alderman Aaron Buffo were in attendance. Alderman Dave Waldorf was absent. A live video stream of the Public Hearing was made available online to the public.

City of Peru Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert provided a summary of the Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program, stating:

- The Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program has \$20,000,000 available. The grants will be awarded until the money runs out.
- The program provides 60 days of verifiable working capital up to a grant ceiling of \$25,000.
- A business must employ 50 people or fewer (that can include the business owner).
- The program is to assist private, for-profit, small retail and service businesses or non-essential businesses (per the Governor's Executive Order) without the ability for working remotely.
- Projects must demonstrate an urgent need for funding due to the COVID-19 emergency and must show a solid commitment to retaining permanent jobs.
- The funding must be used for working capital expenses (for example, employee salaries, general operating expenses, inventory, and advertising/marketing expenses).
- Businesses involved in medical and/or recreational cannabis are not eligible to apply.
- Costs incurred prior to the date of grant award are not reimbursable.
- A grant agreement will be issued for a contract period of twelve months. All grants must have met the National Objective of retaining permanent jobs primarily benefiting low-to-moderate income persons by the end of the twelve-month grant term.
- If circumstances beyond a grantee's control are apparent and impact the project, a grantee may apply for a single six-month extension.
- If the National Objective is not met by the benefiting business, then the grantee (unit of local government) will be required to repay the entire amount of the grant to the State. The benefiting business will be required to repay the entire amount of the grant to the unit of local government per the enforcement of the Participation Agreement signed by the business and government body.

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert explained that the City is considering an application for a grant on behalf of Salon Patrice, 1525 Peoria Street, Peru. The City Council was provided with copies of the City's application on behalf of Salon Patrice. Attorney Schweickert stated that the total amount of grant funds being requested on behalf of Salon Patrice is \$15,280.00, and that the public can obtain copies of the application from the City Clerk's office.

Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert explained that only \$20,000,000.00 of funds is available under the Downstate Small Business Stabilization Program. Any awarded grants are administered by the City to the business for working capital pursuant to a Participation Agreement with the business. Grant funds awarded through this program will support City businesses, such as Salon Patrice, which have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 emergency and the Governor's Executive "Stay at Home" Order and will help them remain open or reopen and retain or re-employ permanent jobs after the COVID-19 emergency is over. The City has the right to claw back grant funds from the

business if it fails to observe or perform any covenant or agreement contained the Participation Agreement. The City is required to submit a 6-month report and close-out report with respect to the disbursed funds.

Patrice Nimee was in attendance at the Public Hearing remotely on behalf of the Salon Patrice and thanked the City for its assistance with the grant application.

A call for public comment was made. Hearing none, the Public Hearing was concluded at 6:38 p.m.

Mr. Jon Chamlin of Vermillion Partners noted the property qualified in all aspects to the qualification requirements as a dispensary and noted the two dispensaries will be awarded by the state.

Alderman Sapienza read a prepared statement. We're fortunate to have an opportunity to make a decision that could not only save a life but make our community a better place. Two years ago, we couldn't walk in the front door of city hall without seeing the degradation of two drug houses right across the street. It took a few hundred thousand dollars to clean up that mess.

The City of Peru just passed a multimillion dollar police department project that, as the Mayor rightfully stated, could have been paid for with cash. As it is it will be paid for without even raising taxes. The point is, due to hard work and good management, Peru is financially very well off.

Today we're going to be asked to vote on something that, with a little extra effort and a little sense of what's right, could help the youth and citizens of Peru in our effort to combat the seemingly never-ending drug problem.

I'm looking for each and every one of you to do the right thing and support the creation of an ordinance that will take the revenue generated from sales of adult cannabis and put it directly into programs that educate, rehabilitate, and the enforcement of drug abuse for the youth and citizens of Peru. This ordinance will be to use cannabis revenues to work toward reducing a drug problem that seems to have no solution.

The reality of simply voting "NO" for our city having adult cannabis sales is not doing the right thing. It may make you feel good, but it doesn't help the problem. It just goes to a nearby city and they may not use the money to do the right thing as we're proposing here. We are the Leader of the Valley. Let's show our leadership or is it just about the money?

Now can I count on you to vote for such an ordinance? Because if I can count on you to do the right thing, we will all be able to vote YES on an Adult Cannabis Facility in Peru and feel a sense of accomplishment in our fight against drugs in our community and you don't support such an ordinance I guess you're just interested in the money and don't care about the problem. Remember, just voting NO simply moves it to a neighboring city. We can be different here and do something about our drug problem with the actual money generated from it.

Can I count on you to support for such an ordinance?

The Council was in favor allocating a portion of the future revenue towards fighting addiction.

Mayor Harl noted an additional \$250.00 was donated to the COVID-19 Relief Fund which now tops \$30,000.

Mayor Harl noted the benefit of the Buxton analytics. Alderman Payton was encouraged by the benefit of having Buxton.

Alderman Buffo reported on team practices in Phase 3 and his wish to open ball diamonds, parks and batting cages.

Mayor Harl stated the city-sponsored Independence Day fireworks show along Water Street will be canceled this summer and stated the \$30,000 display was cut from the city's budget during a Finance Committee meeting as a way to save money, especially with the uncertainty of coronavirus costs.

Alderman Aaron Buffo had suggested the city attempt a drive-in firework display at the Peru Mall, but the idea did not proceed further.

Alderman Payton asked to consider portable handwashing stations in parks.

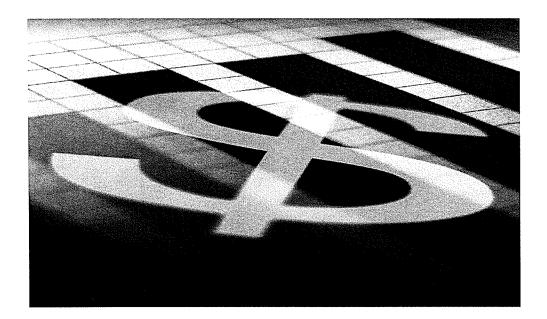

The Peru Volunteer Ambulance Service responded to two hundred thirty-one (231) patient/calls during the month of April. The two hundred thirty-one (231) patient/calls included one hundred thirty-one (131) emergencies for Peru, five (5) emergencies for Dimmick, zero (0) emergencies for Peru Township, and ninety-two (92) transfers. Of the one hundred thirty-six (136) emergencies, eighty-three (83) patients were transported, forty-five (45) patients refused treatment, seven (7) were disregarded, and one (1) was a stand-by.

Peru Volunteer Ambulance Service, Inc. responded to two (2) Mutual Aid requests with La Salle Ambulance and one (1) Mutual Aid request with Marseilles Ambulance.

The total mileage logged was 10313 miles for the month of April.

Baumgarten and Ann E. Baumgarten (hereinafter "Petitioners") concerning property generally located at 1901 Pine Street, Peru, IL, legally described as follows:

Lot Seventeen (17) in Highland View Subdivision in the City of Peru, according to the Plat thereof recorded July 9, 1964 in Book "X" of Plats, at Pages 20, 21, and 22 as Doc. No. 503700, except coal and minerals and the right to mine and remove the same, situated in LaSalle County, Illinois

PIN: 17-16-126-005 (hereinafter "Property").

Petitioners desire to construct a fence on the Property and request the following variance(s)/waiver(s) from the City's Zoning Ordinance:

- (1) A variance/waiver from the requirements of Section 6.03(b)(2) of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of a fence in the front yard of the Property which is greater than three feet (3') in height and greater than twenty feet (20') in length;

After first being duly sworn, Petitioner Daniel G. Baumgarten testified that the Property has a very small backyard and Petitioners would like to construct a semi-decorative fence to enclose the front and side yard of the Property to safely contain their young children and dog.

In response to questioning from Chairman Miller, Mr. Baumgarten stated the fence would be semi-decorative and not a privacy fence. It would be similar to a white picket style fence, made of aluminum or plastic.

In response to questioning from Member Lucas, Mr. Baumgarten testified that the fence would not be a big monstrosity, but rather 4' in height.

Chairman Miller stated that the concern would be visibility for traffic traveling west on 14th Street and south on Pine Street. Mr. Baumgarten stated the fence would have thinner uprights spaced approximately 4 inches apart like a wrought iron fence and shouldn't block any views. Mr. Baumgarten then showed the P/Z Commission a photograph of the proposed fence style, a copy of which is attached hereto.

In response to questioning from Member Atkinson, Mr. Baumgarten said there is a light pole on the southwest corner of the Property and he might consider a diagonal corner to further reduce any traffic safety concerns.

In response to questioning from Member Lucas, Mr. Baumgarten testified that Petitioners plan to have 3 gates installed: one along the front sidewalk, one near the driveway, and one in the backyard.

In response to questioning from Member Kalsto, Mr. Baumgarten testified that he had spoken to his neighbors and none of them expressed concerns or objections.

Alderman Ballard was present at the meeting and stated that he was one of Petitioners' neighbors. Alderman Ballard said he and his wife support the Petition and don't believe the fence will impair visibility, noting traffic is required to stop at the intersection anyways. Member Atkinson added that he agreed the fence would not impair visibility if the fence was of the style shown in the attached photograph.

In response to further questioning from Chairman Miller, Mr. Baumgarten stated the fence would be aluminum.

There were no objectors at the hearing.

The Planning/Zoning Commission found that the requested variances will not alter the essential character of the locality; will not be detrimental or injurious to other properties in the area; will not impair an adequate supply of light or air to adjacent properties, or increase the danger of fire, or

endanger the public safety, or diminish or impair property values and will not increase street congestion and, therefore, recommends to the City Council that the variances be granted.

Member Lucas moved, and Member Atkinson seconded, that the requested variance/waiver from Section 6.03(b)(2) of the Zoning Ordinance to allow for the construction of a fence on the Property greater than 3' in height and 20' in length, be favorably recommended to the City Council. The motion passed unanimously: 6 aye, 0 nay, and 1 Members absent.

Dave,

On behalf of the Starved Rock Runners, we are looking to obtain permission to hold the SRRL Kid Running Clinic at Baker Lake, on Monday evenings starting on July 6th, and ending on August 10th. The Clinic start at 6PM and ends at 7PM.

This Clinic teaches the kids running skills and preps them to participate in the Boo Milby 5K, which is scheduled for August 20.

The Kids Clinic is held in conjunction with the SRRL Women's Running Clinic which meets at Northwest School (just a few blocks away), at the same time.

In the past the Clinic has been open to age 6 and up, but this year due to the Pandemic we are going eliminate the 6-7 year old group, and possibly even the 8-9 year old group.

Our coaches will make every attempt and be vigilant about following the guidelines set forth for such an event.

Our committees have been in a holding pattern finalizing plans to see the what the updated guidelines for group events brought. Now that we have this at information, we will be meeting in the next week or two to tentatively finalize our plans, and then that will be reviewed again after the 1st of July and adjusted accordingly.

At this time our plans are to limit age groups to groups of 10 (two coaches and 8 kids), based on our coach volunteer numbers. In the past the Clinic has had participation of approximately 90-100 Kids. This year we anticipate our participation to be 40-60 kids. Per the current guideline, groups will be limited to ten (with coaches), and groups will stay 30' apart. Coaches will monitor to keep the kids at the 6' apart, and will be instructed to work with their group away from others.

If masks are still a requirement at the time of th Clinic, we will require kids to have masks or not allow them to participate.
