City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Tieman, Payton, Edgcomb, Waldorf, Sapienza, Lukosus and Buffo present. Alderman Ballard absent; Mayor Kolowski present.

All joined in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Clerk Bartley presented the National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week (April 10-16, 2022).

Deputy Police Chief Sarah Raymond recognized Peru Police Dispatcher Christy DeGroot.

### MINUTES/FINANCIAL REPORTS/ACTIVITY REPORTS

Mayor Kolowski presented the Regular Minutes of March 28, 2022, Peru Police Department Report for March 2022 and Building Permit Report-1<sup>st</sup> Quarter. Alderman Waldorf made a motion the minutes and report be received and placed on file. Alderman Payton seconded the motion; motion carried.

Clerk Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Tieman, Payton, Edgcomb, Waldorf, Sapienza, Lukosus and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Ballard absent; motion carried.

Alderman Payton made a motion to approve \$1,000.00 donation to support the Peru CSO Banner program. Alderman Sapienza seconded the motion. Clerk Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Tieman, Payton, Edgcomb, Waldorf, Sapienza, Lukosus and Buffo voting aye; Alderman Ballard absent; motion carried.

Finance Director Justin Miller reminded the council of the FY23 budget hearing on April 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. and reported the full, searchable budget is available on the city's website.

Alderman Lukosus made a motion the petition be received, placed on file and referred to Planning/Zoning for review and recommendation. Alderman Waldorf seconded the motion; motion carried.

Clerk Bartley presented a petition from Maitri Path to Wellness requesting text amendment and special use for property located at 710 Peoria Street, Peru, IL. Alderman Sapienza made a motion the petition be received, placed on file and referred to Planning/Zoning Commission for review and recommendation. Alderman Edgcomb seconded the motion; motion carried.

Clerk Bartley presented a communication from Rita Studzinski of the River Valley Chapter of The Compassionate Friends requesting permission to hold their annual memory walk on Sunday, September 25<sup>th</sup> at Baker Lake. Alderman Tieman made a motion the communication be received, placed on file and permission granted. Alderman Buffo seconded the motion; motion carried.

Clerk Bartley presented a communication from Riverfront Bar and Grill requesting curfew time for live music on the weekends be extended from 10:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. and decibel limit from 65 to 85. Alderman Waldorf made a motion to refer the communication to Corporate Counsel to research. Alderman Sapienza seconded the motion; motion carried. Aldermen Sapienza and Payton suggested asking the business if it would be able to erect sound barriers to help prevent the noise from being heard on the bluff and direct it toward the Illinois River. Deputy Chief Sarah Raymond advised the council to do its homework and have a discussion at the committee level, because the noise could affect residents that live on the bluff over Riverfront Bar and Grill. Deputy Chief Raymond said the noise level would be registered at the bluff and not at the business. Deputy Chief Raymond stated the business has been issued a citation in its past for violating the city's noise ordinance. Alderman Tieman stated whatever the council decides, it has to apply it to all businesses and should be fair across the board; council said they weren't aware of many other outdoor venues. Mayor Kolowski said the ordinance applies to residents having backyard parties as well and that factor would need to be considered. Mayor Kolowski asked Corporate Counsel Scott Schweickert to research on a per-night exception.

Mr. Thorson also reported on the success of the reserve sensory hour for special needs.

City Clerk Dave Bartley called the roll with Aldermen Ballard, Tieman, Payton, Edgcomb, Waldorf, Sapienza, Lukosus and Buffo present; Mayor Kolowski present.

Special Counsel Herb Klein addressed the council and reported the establishment of the Peru MVP TIF District is to accommodate an industrial customer. (The City intends to use the Peru MVP TIF District to redevelop property that is currently underutilized for industrial manufacturing and warehousing space and related commercial businesses to help to increase population, improve employment opportunities, expand and diversify the local real estate tax base, manage growth and increase the overall quality of life for its residents. The Redevelopment Plan will allow the City to alleviate and/or remove blighting conditions such as the lack of adequate public infrastructure, increase Peru's overall competitiveness in the region and institute public policies that are more conducive to business development.)



Pursuant to legal notice published in the News Tribune in the manner provided by law, the Planning/Zoning Commission of the City of Peru convened for a public hearing on Wednesday, April 20, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. in the City Municipal Building, 1901 Fourth Street, Peru, IL, to consider the Petition of Joe Welte (hereinafter "Petitioner") concerning real estate located at 4401-4431 Progress Boulevard, Peru, IL, legally described as follows:

Lot 10 in Interstate Acres Addition to the City of Peru, being a part of the Northwest Quarter of Section 4, Township 33 North, Range 1 East of the Third Principal Meridian, according to the plat thereof recorded November 21, 1978, as Doc. No. 678124 in Plat Cabinet A, Pages 112 and 113, all situated in the County of LaSalle and State of Illinois.

PIN: 17-04-101-009 (hereinafter "Property").

Petitioner desires to construct a 40' x 92' addition and requests the following relief under the City's Zoning Ordinance, to wit:

- (1) A variance to reduce the south side yard setback abutting street from not less than forty feet (40'), as provided in Section 11.05(h)(3), to not less than zero feet (0');
- (2) Waiver of the storm water detention requirements contained in Section 11.09 of the Subdivision and Site Development Ordinance; and
- (3) For such other and further relief as may be required.

The Property is located in a B-4, Highway Business District.

Planning/Zoning Commission Members Miller, Atkinson, Lucas, Kalsto, Grabowski, Brady, and Moreno were all present at the hearing. No Members were absent.

Petitioner Joe Welte appeared and was duly sworn. Mr. Welte testified that they would like to add a 40' addition on the south end of the existing building. One of the current building tenants plans to move into the new addition, and a new tenant plans to move to into the vacated space.

In response to questioning by Chairman Miller regarding the submitted drawings, Mr. Welte said the drawingS do not do justice to the planned design. Keeping in line with the rest of the building, Petitioner hopes to incorporate the look of an early 1900s fire station on the front façade of the addition.

In response to questioning by Member Lucas, Petitioner said the addition would be of similar style and quality materials as the rest of the building. Due to material shortages, actual red brick may be used to speed up the project. Mr. Welte added that he may increase the height of the façade on the addition to match the varying "stair-stepped" heights of the existing building, but it would not be higher than any existing façade.

In response to questioning from Chairman Miller, Engineer Carls said the requested relief will not impact parking or stormwater detention requirements. The site served by a regional stormwater detention facility north of Menards. Engineer Carls favorably recommended approval.

In response to questioning from Member Brady, Engineer Carls said the road right-of-way is 70'. From the center of the road to the edge of the addition will be 35'. Carls added that he did not believe there would be any line of site issues due to the distance the building is set back from Progress Boulevard. Petitioner said they measured it out and the City would still have 25' of green space in the right-of-way.

There were no objectors or public comments.

The Planning/Zoning Commission found the requested variance and waiver will not alter the essential character of the locality; will not be detrimental or injurious to other properties in the area; will not impair an adequate supply of light or air to adjacent properties, or increase the danger of fire, or endanger the public safety, or diminish or impair property values and will not increase street congestion and, therefore, recommends to the City Council that the Petition be granted.

Member Lucas moved, and Chairman Miller seconded, to favorably recommend the City Council approve the requested relief as prayed for in the Petition. The motion passed unanimously: 7 aye, 0 nay, and 0 Members absent.

## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF PURCHASE CONTRACTS BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF PERU AND BUREAU COUNTY, AS TRUSTEE.

(Bureau County PINs: 18-14-701-002 & 18-13-701-004)

**WHEREAS**, the City of Peru (the "City") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970, and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City's home rule powers and the laws of the State of Illinois including, without limitation, 65 ILCS 5/2-2-12, 65 ILCS 5/11-76.1-1, 65 ILCS 5/8-1-2.5, and 65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-4; the City is authorized to make and enter into contracts to purchase and acquire real property, or rights or interests therein, for public and economic development purposes; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 18, 2022, the City Counsel duly passed and adopted several ordinances and resolutions related to the adoption of the proposed Peru MVP TIF District; and

WHEREAS, certain property included in the boundaries of the proposed Peru MVP TIF District have had coal/mineral rights severed from the fee estates thereof back when coal mining was an active industry in the local area; and

WHEREAS, coal mining operations ceased locally approximately 100 years ago, and the aforementioned coal/mineral interests have since become dormant, abandoned, or have not been subject to proper taxation; and

WHEREAS, on November 1, 2017, certain coal/mineral interests severed from properties located within or adjacent to the boundaries of the proposed Peru MVP TIF District, specifically Bureau County PINs 18-14-701-002 and 18-13-701-004, were sold at public auction for nonpayment of taxes and, after receiving no bids, were conveyed by Tax Deed to Bureau County, as Trustee; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that acquisition of the aforementioned coal/mineral interests identified by Bureau County PINs 18-14-701-002 and 18-13-701-004 will encourage investment and provide greater assurance to prospective developments within the proposed Peru MVP TIF District; and

WHEREAS, the Trustee for Bureau County has agreed to sell, and the City has agreed to purchase, the coal/mineral interests identified by Bureau County PINs 18-14-701-002 and 18-13-701-004 for \$816.00 each; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and determines that acquisition of the aforementioned coal/mineral interests is a matter pertaining to the government and affairs of the City, is necessary for the success of the proposed MVP TIF District, will provide City with greater control over the development and use of property within and immediately adjacent to the City's MVP TIF District, is for a proper public

purpose, will provide a benefit to the public in perpetuity, and will promote the health, safety, and welfare of the City and its citizens.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERU, LASALLE AND BUREAU COUNTIES, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

**<u>SECTION 1:</u>** <u>Recitals.</u> The foregoing recitals shall be, and they are hereby, incorporated as findings of fact by the City Council as if fully set forth herein.

**SECTION 2:** Authorization. The Mayor and City Clerk, and each of them, for and behalf of the City, are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Purchase Contracts with Bureau County, as Trustee, copies of which are attached hereto, and to perform all other acts and deeds necessary to effect the purchase of the coal/mineral interests identified by Bureau County PINs 18-14-701-002 and 18-13-701-004 for their respective price identified therein.

**<u>SECTION 3:</u>** <u>Effective Date.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

## ADOPTING AND CODIFYING A REVISED SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES DEPLOYMENT ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act (hereinafter, "Act"), 50 ILCS 840/1 *et seq.*, effective June 1, 2018, was amended by Public Act 102-0009, effective June 1, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Peru (hereinafter, "City") is an Illinois home rule municipal corporation in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the City is authorized, under existing state and federal law, to enact appropriate regulations and restrictions relative to small wireless facilities, distributed antenna systems and other personal wireless telecommunication facility installations in the public right-ofway as long as it does not conflict with state and federal law; and

**WHEREAS,** the Act sets forth the requirements for the collocation of small wireless facilities by local authorities; and

WHEREAS, on June 25, 2018, the City adopted a Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Ordinance known as Ordinance No. 6296, entitled: "ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF AND APPLICATION FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES"; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 6296 mistakenly purported to eliminate and replace in its entirety Ordinance No. 6219, entitled: "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SMALL CELL ANTENNA/TOWER RIGHT-OF-WAY SITING", duly adopted by the City on May 17, 2017; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council finds and determines it is necessary and in the best interest of the City to replace Ordinance No. 6296 with this Ordinance in order to reaffirm that Ordinance No. 6219 remains in full force and effect, to make further revisions in accordance with the Act as amended by Public Act 102-0009, and to adopt and codify such provisions in the City's Code of Ordinances.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERU, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1**: <u>Recitals.</u> The foregoing recitals shall be and are hereby incorporated as findings of fact as if said recitals were fully set forth herein.

**SECTION 2**: Ordinance No. 6296. Ordinance No. 6296, entitled: "ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF AND APPLICATION FOR SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES" adopted Jun 25, 2018, shall be and is hereby replaced in its entirety by this Ordinance.

**SECTION 3**: Ordinance No. 6219. The City Council hereby reaffirms that Ordinance No. 6219, entitled: "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING SMALL CELL ANTENNA/TOWER RIGHT-OF-WAY SITING", duly passed by the City on May 17, 2017, remains in full force and effect. Should any provisions of Ordinance No. 6219 conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance, this Ordinance shall control.

SECTION 4: Adoption and Codification of Revised Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Ordinance. Chapter 106 – Telecommunications of the City of Peru's Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to provide for the adoption of a new "Article IV. - SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES", which shall provide as follows:

# **Chapter 106- TELECOMMUNICATIONS**

## **ARTICLE IV. – SMALL WIRELESS FACILITIES** Sec. 106-100. - Purpose and Scope.

- (a) *Purpose*. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish regulations, standards and procedures for the siting and collocation of small wireless facilities on rights-of-way within the City's jurisdiction, or outside the rights-of-way on property zoned by the City-exclusively for commercial or industrial use, in a manner that is consistent with the Act.
- (b) *Conflicts with Other Ordinances*. This Ordinance supersedes all Ordinances or parts of Ordinances adopted prior hereto that are in conflict herewith, to the extent of such conflict.
- (c) *Conflicts with State and Federal Laws*. In the event that applicable state or federal laws or regulations conflict with the requirements of this Ordinance, the wireless provider shall comply with the requirements of this Ordinance to the maximum extent possible without violating state or federal laws or regulations.

**Sec. 106-101. - Definitions.** For the purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

Antenna – communications equipment that transmits or receives electromagnetic radio frequency (RF) radiation, to be operated or operating from a fixed location pursuant to Federal Communications Commission (FCC) authorization, for the provision of personal wireless service and any commingled information services. The antenna does not include an unintentional radiator, mobile station or device.

*Applicable codes* – uniform building, fire, electrical, plumbing, or mechanical codes adopted by a recognized national code organization or local amendments to those codes, including the National Electric Safety Code.

*Applicant* – any person or entity that submits an application and the agents, employees and contractors of such person or entity.

Application – a request submitted by an applicant to the City for a permit to collocate small wireless facilities at a specified location, and a request that includes the installation of a new utility pole for such collocation, as well as any applicable fee for the review of such application.

*Collocate* or *collocation* – to install, mount, maintain, modify, operate, or replace wireless facilities on or adjacent to a wireless support structure or utility pole.

*Communications service* – cable service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 522(6), as amended; information service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(24), as amended; telecommunications service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(53), as amended; mobile service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(53), as amended; or wireless service other than mobile service.

*Communications service provider* – a cable operator, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 522(5), as amended; a provider of information service, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(24), as amended; a telecommunications carrier, as defined in 47 U.S.C. 153(51), as amended; or a wireless provider.

FCC – the Federal Communications Commission of the United States.

*Fee* – a one-time charge.

*Historic district* or *historic landmark* – a building, property, or site, or group of buildings, properties, or sites that are either (i) listed in the National Register of Historic Places or formally determined eligible for listing by the Keeper of the National Register, the individual who has been delegated the authority by the federal agency to list properties and determine their eligibility for the National Register, in accordance with Section VI.D.1.a.i through Section VI.D.1.a.v of the Nationwide Programmatic Agreement codified at 47 CFR Part 1, Appendix C; or (ii) designated as a locally landmarked building, property, site, or historic district by an ordinance adopted by the City pursuant to a preservation program that meets the requirements of the Certified Local Government Program of the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office or where such certification of the preservation program by the Illinois State Historic Preservation Office is pending.

Law – a federal or state statute, common law, code, rule, regulation, order, or local ordinance or resolution.

*Micro wireless facility* – a small wireless facility that is not larger in dimension than 24 inches in length, 15 inches in width, and 12 inches in height and that has an exterior antenna, if any, no longer than 11 inches.

*Municipal utility pole* – a utility pole owned or operated by the City in public rightsof-way.

*Permit* – a written authorization required by the City to perform an action or initiate, continue or complete a project.

*Person* – an individual, corporation, limited liability company, partnership, association, trust or other entity or organization.

*Public safety agency* – the functional division of the federal government, the state, a unit of local government, or a special purpose district located in whole or in part within this state, that provides or has authority to provide firefighting, police, ambulance, medical, or other emergency services to respond to and manage emergency incidents.

#### *Rate* – a recurring charge.

Right-of-way – the area on, below, or above a public roadway, highway, street, public sidewalk, alley or utility easement dedicated for compatible use. Right-of-way does not include City-owned aerial lines.

*Small wireless facility* – a wireless facility that meets both of the following qualifications: (i) each antenna is located inside an enclosure of no more than six cubic feet in volume or, in the case of an antenna that has exposed elements, the antenna and all of its exposed elements could fit within an imaginary enclosure of no more than six cubic feet; and (ii) all other wireless equipment attached directly to a utility pole associated with the facility is cumulatively no more than 25 cubic feet in volume. The following types of associated ancillary equipment are not included in the calculation of equipment volume: electric meter, concealment elements, telecommunications demarcation box, ground-based enclosures, grounding equipment, power transfer switch, cut-off switch, and vertical cable runs for the connection of power and other services.

 $Utility \ pole - a \ pole \ or \ similar \ structure \ that \ is used \ in \ whole \ or \ in \ part \ by \ a \ communications \ service \ provider \ or \ for \ electric \ distribution, \ lighting, \ traffic \ control, \ or \ a \ similar \ function.$ 

*Wireless facility* – equipment at a fixed location that enables wireless communications between user equipment and a communications network, including: (i) equipment associated with wireless communications; and (ii) radio transceivers, antennas, coaxial or fiber-optic cable, regular and backup power supplies, and comparable equipment, regardless of technological configuration. Wireless facility includes small wireless facilities. Wireless facility does not include: (i) the structure or improvements on, under, or within which the equipment is collocated; or (ii) wireline backhaul facilities,

coaxial or fiber optic cable that is between wireless support structures or utility poles or coaxial, or fiber optic cable that is otherwise not immediately adjacent to or directly associated with an antenna.

*Wireless infrastructure provider* – any person authorized to provide telecommunications service in the state that builds or installs wireless communication transmission equipment, wireless facilities, wireless support structures, or utility poles and that is not a wireless services provider but is acting as an agent or a contractor for a wireless services provider for the application submitted to the City.

Wireless provider – a wireless infrastructure provider or a wireless services provider.

*Wireless services* – any services provided to the general public, including a particular class of customers, and made available on a nondiscriminatory basis using licensed or unlicensed spectrum, whether at a fixed location or mobile, provided using wireless facilities.

*Wireless services provider* – a person who provides wireless services.

*Wireless support structure* – a freestanding structure, such as a monopole; tower, either guyed or self-supporting; billboard; or other existing or proposed structure designed to support or capable of supporting wireless facilities. Wireless support structure does not include a utility pole.

#### Sec. 106-102. - Regulation of Small Wireless Facilities.

- (a) Permitted Use. Small wireless facilities shall be classified as permitted uses and subject to administrative review, except as provided in Section 106-103(i) regarding Height Exceptions or Variances, but not subject to zoning review or approval if they are collocated (i) in rights-of-way in any zoning district, or (ii) outside rights-of-way in property zoned exclusively for commercial or industrial use.
- (b) *Permit Required*. An applicant shall obtain one or more permits from the City to collocate a small wireless facility. An application shall be received and processed, and permits issued shall be subject to the following conditions and requirements:
  - (1) <u>Application Requirements</u>. A wireless provider shall provide the following information to the City, together with the City's Small Cell Facilities Permit Application, as a condition of any permit application to collocate small wireless facilities on a utility pole or wireless support structure:
    - a. Site specific structural integrity and, for a municipal utility pole, makeready analysis prepared by a structural engineer, as that term is defined in Section 4 of the Structural Engineering Practice Act of 1989;

- b. The location where each proposed small wireless facility or utility pole would be installed and photographs of the location and its immediate surroundings depicting the utility poles or structures on which each proposed small wireless facility would be mounted or location where utility poles or structures would be installed. This should include a depiction of the completed facility;
- c. Specifications and drawings prepared by a structural engineer, as that term is defined in Section 4 of the Structural Engineering Practice Act of 1989, for each proposed small wireless facility covered by the application as it is proposed to be installed;
- d. The equipment type and model numbers for the antennas and all other wireless equipment associated with the small wireless facility;
- e. A proposed schedule for the installation and completion of each small wireless facility covered by the application, if approved; and
- f. Certification that the collocation complies with the Collocation Requirements and Conditions provided in Section 106-103, to the best of the applicant's knowledge.
- g. In the event that the proposed small wireless facility is to be attached to an existing pole owned by an entity other than the City, the wireless provider shall provide legally competent evidence of the consent of the owner of such pole to the proposed collocation.
- h. Certification by a radio engineer that a new, replacement or modified small wireless facility operates within all applicable FCC standards.
- (2) <u>Application Process</u>. The City-shall process applications as follows:
  - a. The first completed application shall have priority over applications received by different applicants for collocation on the same utility pole or wireless support structure.
  - b. An application to collocate a small wireless facility on an existing utility pole or wireless support structure, or replacement of an existing utility pole or wireless support structure shall be processed on a nondiscriminatory basis and shall be deemed approved if the City fails to approve or deny the application within 90 days after the submission of a completed application.

However, if an applicant intends to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, the applicant shall notify the City in writing of its intention to invoke the deemed approved remedy no sooner than 75 days after the submission of a completed application. The permit shall be deemed approved on the latter of the 90th day after submission of the complete application or the 10th day after the receipt of the deemed approved notice by the City. The receipt of the deemed approved notice shall not preclude the City denial of the permit request within the time limits as provided under this Ordinance.

FCC regulation provides that an application to collocate a small wireless facility using an existing structure shall be granted or denied within 60 days of submission of a completed application. Delays beyond that time limit are available only in exceptional circumstances. These FCC time limits may be enforced through litigation.

c. An application to collocate a small wireless facility that includes the installation of a new utility pole shall be processed on a nondiscriminatory basis and deemed approved if the City fails to approve or deny the application within 120 days after the submission of a completed application.

However, if an applicant intends to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, the applicant shall notify the City in writing of its intention to invoke the deemed approved remedy no sooner than 105 days after the submission of a completed application.

The permit shall be deemed approved on the latter of the 120th day after submission of the complete application or the 10th day after the receipt of the deemed approved notice by the City. The receipt of the deemed approved notice shall not preclude the City's denial of the permit request within the time limits as provided under this Ordinance.

FCC regulation provides that an application to collocate a small wireless facility using a new structure shall be granted or denied within 90 days of submission of a completed application. Delays beyond that time limit are available only in exceptional circumstances. These FCC time limits may be enforced through litigation.

d. The City shall deny an application which does not meet the requirements of this Chapter.

If the City determines that applicable codes, ordinances or regulations that concern public safety, or the Collocation Requirements and Conditions contained herein require that the utility pole or wireless support structure be replaced before the requested collocation, approval shall be conditioned on the replacement of the utility pole or wireless support structure at the cost of the provider.

The City shall document the basis for a denial, including the specific code provisions or application conditions on which the denial is based, and send the documentation to the applicant on or before the day the City denies an application.

The applicant may cure the deficiencies identified by the City and resubmit the revised application once within 30 days after notice of denial is sent to the applicant without paying an additional application fee. The City shall approve or deny the revised application within 30 days after the applicant resubmits the application or it is deemed approved. Failure to resubmit the revised application within 30 days of denial shall require the applicant to submit a new application with applicable fees, and recommencement of the City's review period.

The applicant must notify the City in writing of its intention to proceed with the permitted activity on a deemed approved basis, which may be submitted with the revised application.

Any review of a revised application shall be limited to the deficiencies cited in the denial. However, this revised application does not apply if the cure requires the review of a new location, new or different structure to be collocated upon, new antennas, or other wireless equipment associated with the small wireless facility.

- e. *Pole Attachment Agreement.* Within 30 days after an approved permit to collocate a small wireless facility on a municipal utility pole, the City and the applicant shall enter into a Master Pole Attachment Agreement, provided by the City for the initial collocation on a municipal utility pole by the application. For subsequent approved permits to collocate on a small wireless facility on a municipal utility pole, the City and the applicant shall enter into a License Supplement of the Master Pole Attachment Agreement.
- (3) <u>Completeness of Application</u>. Within 10 days after receiving an application, the City shall determine whether the application is complete and notify the applicant. If an application is incomplete, the City must specifically identify the missing information. An application shall be deemed complete if the City fails to provide notification to the applicant within 10 days after all documents, information and fees specifically enumerated in the City's permit application form are submitted by the applicant to the City. FCC regulation allows 10 days for determination of completion, and that 10-day time frame replaces the 30-day period provided in the state Act.

Processing deadlines are tolled from the time the City sends the notice of incompleteness to the time the applicant provides the missing information.

- (4) <u>Tolling</u>. The time period for applications may be further tolled by:
  - a. An express written agreement by both the applicant and the City; or
  - b. A local, state or federal disaster declaration or similar emergency that causes the delay.
- (5) <u>Consolidated Applications</u>. An applicant seeking to collocate small wireless facilities within the jurisdiction of the City-shall be allowed, at the applicant's discretion, to file a consolidated application and receive a single permit for the collocation of up to 25 small wireless facilities if the collocations each involve substantially the same type of small wireless facility and substantially the same type of structure.

If an application includes multiple small wireless facilities, the City may remove small wireless facility collocations from the application and treat separately small wireless facility collocations for which incomplete information has been provided, or that do not qualify for consolidated treatment, or that are denied. The City may issue separate permits for each collocation that is approved in a consolidated application.

(6) <u>Duration of Permits</u>. The duration of a permit shall be for a period of not less than 5 years, and the permit shall be renewed for equivalent durations unless the City makes a finding that the small wireless facilities or the new or modified utility pole do not comply with the applicable City codes or any provision, condition or requirement contained in this Ordinance.

If the Act is repealed as provided in Section 90 therein, renewals of permits shall be subject to the applicable City code provisions or regulations in effect at the time of renewal.

(7) <u>Means of Submitting Applications</u>. Applicants shall submit applications, supporting information and notices to the City by personal delivery at the City's designated place of business, by regular mail postmarked on the date due or by any other commonly used means, including electronic mail.

#### Sec. 106-103. - Collocation Requirements and Conditions.

- (a) Public Safety Space Reservation. The City may reserve space on municipal utility poles for future public safety uses, for the City's electric utility uses, or both, but a reservation of space may not preclude the collocation of a small wireless facility unless the City reasonably determines that the municipal utility pole cannot accommodate both uses.
- (b) Installation and Maintenance. The wireless provider shall install, maintain, repair and modify its small wireless facilities in safe condition and good repair and in compliance with the requirements and conditions of this Ordinance. The wireless provider shall ensure that its employees, agents or contracts that perform work in connection with its small wireless facilities are adequately trained and skilled in accordance with all applicable industry and governmental standards and regulations.
- (c) *No interference with public safety communication frequencies.* The wireless provider's operation of the small wireless facilities shall not interfere with the frequencies used by a public safety agency for public safety communications.

A wireless provider shall install small wireless facilities of the type and frequency that will not cause unacceptable interference with a public safety agency's communications equipment.

Unacceptable interference will be determined by and measured in accordance with industry standards and the FCC's regulations addressing unacceptable interference to public safety spectrum or any other spectrum licensed by a public safety agency.

If a small wireless facility causes such interference, and the wireless provider has been given written notice of the interference by the public safety agency, the wireless provider, at its own expense, shall remedy the interference in a manner consistent with the abatement and resolution procedures for interference with public safety spectrum established by the FCC including 47 CFR 22.970 through 47 CFR 22.973 and 47 CFR 90.672 through 47 CFR 90.675.

The City may terminate a permit for a small wireless facility based on such interference if the wireless provider is not in compliance with the Code of Federal Regulations cited in the previous paragraph. Failure to remedy the interference as required herein shall constitute a public nuisance.

(d) The wireless provider shall not collocate small wireless facilities on City utility poles that are part of an electric distribution or transmission system within the communication worker safety zone of the pole or the electric supply zone of the pole. However, the antenna and support equipment of the small wireless facility may be located in the communications space on the City utility pole and on the top of the pole, if not otherwise unavailable, if the wireless provider complies with applicable codes for work involving the top of the pole.

For purposes of this subparagraph, the terms "communications space," "communication worker safety zone," and "electric supply zone" have the meanings given to those terms in the National Electric Safety Code as published by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers.

- (e) The wireless provider shall comply with all applicable codes, including acoustic regulations, and local code provisions or regulations that concern public safety.
- (f) The wireless provider shall comply with written design standards that are generally applicable for decorative utility poles, or reasonable stealth, concealment and aesthetic requirements that are set forth in a City ordinance, written policy adopted by the City, a comprehensive plan or other written design plan that applies to other occupiers of the rights-of-way, including on a historic landmark or in a historic district.
- (g) Alternate Placements. Except as provided in this Collocation Requirements and Conditions Section, a wireless provider shall not be required to collocate small wireless facilities on any specific utility pole, or category of utility poles, or be required to collocate multiple antenna systems on a single utility pole. However, with respect to an application for the collocation of a small wireless facility associated with a new utility pole, the City may propose that the small wireless facility be collocated on an existing utility pole or existing wireless support structure within 200 feet of the proposed collocation, which the applicant shall accept if it has the right to use the alternate structure on reasonable terms and conditions, and the alternate location and structure does not impose technical limits or additional material costs as determined by the applicant.

If the applicant refuses a collocation proposed by the City, the applicant shall provide written certification describing the property rights, technical limits or material cost reasons the alternate location does not satisfy the criteria in this paragraph.

(h) *Height Limitations*. The maximum height of a small wireless facility shall be no more than 10 feet above the utility pole or wireless support structure on which the small wireless facility is collocated.

New or replacement utility poles or wireless support structures on which small wireless facilities are collocated may not exceed the higher of:

- (1) 10 feet in height above the tallest existing utility pole, other than a utility pole supporting only wireless facilities, that is in place on the date the application is submitted to the City, that is located within 300 feet of the new or replacement utility pole or wireless support structure and that is in the same right-of-way within the jurisdictional boundary of the City, provided the City may designate which intersecting right-of-way within 300 feet of the proposed utility pole or wireless support structures shall control the height limitation for such facility; or
- (2) 50 feet above ground level. The 50-foot limit provided by FCC regulation replaces the limit of 45 feet under the Act.
- (i) *Height Exceptions or Variances.* If an applicant proposes a height for a new or replacement pole in excess of the above height limitations on which the small wireless facility is proposed for collocation, the applicant shall apply for a variance in conformance with procedures, terms and conditions set forth in the City's Zoning Ordinance.
- (j) *Contractual Design Requirements*. The wireless provider shall comply with requirements that are imposed by a contract between the City and a private property owner that concern design or construction standards applicable to utility poles and ground-mounted equipment located in the right-of-way.
- (k) Ground-mounted Equipment Spacing. The wireless provider shall comply with applicable spacing requirements in applicable codes and ordinances concerning the location of ground-mounted equipment located in the right-of-way if the requirements include a waiver, zoning or other process that addresses wireless provider requests for exception or variance and do not prohibit granting of such exceptions or variances.
- (1) Undergrounding Regulations. The wireless provider shall comply with local code provisions or regulations concerning undergrounding requirements that prohibit the installation of new or the modification of existing utility poles in a right-of-way without prior approval if the requirements include a waiver, zoning or other process that addresses requests to install such new utility poles or modify such existing utility poles and do not prohibit the replacement of utility poles.
- (m) Collocation Completion Deadline. Collocation for which a permit is granted shall be completed within 180 days after issuance of the permit, unless the City and the wireless provider agree to extend this period or a delay is caused by make-ready work for a municipal utility pole or by the lack of commercial power or backhaul availability at the site, provided the wireless provider has made a timely request within 60 days after

the issuance of the permit for commercial power or backhaul services, and the additional time to complete installation does not exceed 360 days after issuance of the permit. Otherwise, the permit shall be void unless the City grants an extension in writing to the applicant.

Sec. 106-104. - Fees. Application fees are imposed as follows:

- (a) Applicant shall pay an application fee of \$650 for an application to collocate a single small wireless facility on an existing utility pole or wireless support structure, and \$350 for each small wireless facility addressed in a consolidated application to collocate more than one small wireless facility on existing utility poles or wireless support structures. The fees established by this ordinance are equal to the limit imposed by the Act and represent a reasonable approximation of the Municipality's objectively reasonable costs. The Municipality shall regularly review the fees imposed and may adjust the fees by further amendment to this ordinance. The safe harbor rate established by the FCC of \$500 for up to five wireless facilities and \$100 for each additional facility in a consolidated application may be exceeded only if justified based on the Municipality's reasonable approximation of its costs.
- (b) Applicant shall pay an application fee of \$1,000 for each small wireless facility addressed in an application that includes the installation of a new utility pole for such collocation.
- (c) Notwithstanding any contrary provision of state law or local ordinance, applications pursuant to this Section shall be accompanied by the required application fee. Application fees shall be non-refundable.
- (d) The City shall not require an application, approval or permit, or require any fees or other charges, from a communications service provider authorized to occupy the rights-of-way, for:
  - (1) routine maintenance;
  - (2) the replacement of wireless facilities with wireless facilities that are substantially similar, the same size, or smaller if the wireless provider notifies the City at least 10 days prior to the planned replacement and includes equipment specifications and certifications consistent with the Section titled Application Requirements; or
  - (3) the installation, placement, maintenance, operation or replacement of micro wireless facilities suspended on cables that are strung between existing utility poles in compliance with applicable safety codes.
- (e) Wireless providers shall secure a permit from the City to work within rights-of-way for activities that affect traffic patterns or require lane closures.

**Sec. 106-105.** - **Exceptions to Applicability.** Nothing in this Ordinance authorizes a person to collocate small wireless facilities on:

- (a) property owned by a private party or property owned or controlled by the City or another unit of local government that is not located within rights-of-way, or a privately owned utility pole or wireless support structure without the consent of the property owner;
- (b) property owned, leased, or controlled by a park district, forest preserve district, or conservation district for public park, recreation or conservation purposes without the consent of the affected district, excluding the placement of facilities on rights-of-way located in an affected district that are under the jurisdiction and control of a different unit of local government as provided by the Illinois Highway Code; or
- (c) property owned by a rail carrier registered under Section 18c-7201 of the Illinois Vehicle Code, Metra Commuter Rail or any other public commuter rail service, or an electric utility as defined in Section 16-102 of the Illinois Public Utilities Act, without the consent of the rail carrier, public commuter rail service, or electric utility. The provisions of this Ordinance do not apply to an electric or gas public utility or such utility's wireless facilities if the facilities are being used, developed and maintained consistent with the provisions of subsection (i) of Section 16-108.5 of the Illinois Public Utilities Act.

For the purposes of this subsection, "public utility" has the meaning given to that term in Section 3-105 of the Illinois Public Utilities Act. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to relieve any person from any requirement: (a) to obtain a franchise or a state-issued authorization to offer cable service or video service; or, (b) to obtain any required permission to install, place, maintain, or operate communications facilities, other than small wireless facilities subject to this Ordinance.

**Sec. 106-106. - Pre-Existing Agreements.** Existing agreements between the City and wireless providers that relate to the collocation of small wireless facilities in the right-of-way, including the collocation of small wireless facilities on City utility poles, that are in effect on June 1, 2018, remain in effect for all small wireless facilities collocated on the City's utility poles pursuant to applications submitted to the City before June 1, 2018, subject to applicable termination provisions contained therein. Agreements entered into after June 1, 2018, shall comply with this Ordinance.

A wireless provider that has an existing agreement with the City on the effective date of the Act may accept the rates, fees and terms that the City makes available under this Ordinance for the collocation of small wireless facilities or the installation of new utility poles for the collocation of small wireless facilities that are the subject of an application submitted two or more years after the effective date of the Act by notifying the City that it opts to accept such rates, fees and terms. The existing agreement remains in effect, subject to applicable termination provisions, for the small wireless facilities the wireless provider has collocated on the City's utility poles pursuant to applications submitted to the City before the wireless provider provides such notice and exercises its option under this paragraph. **Sec. 106-107. - Annual Recurring Rate.** A wireless provider shall pay to the City an annual recurring rate to collocate a small wireless facility on a City utility pole located in a right-of-way that equals (i) \$200 per year or (ii) the actual, direct and reasonable costs related to the wireless provider's use of space on the City utility pole.

If the City has not billed the wireless provider actual and direct costs, the fee shall be \$200 payable on the first day after the first annual anniversary of the issuance of the permit or notice of intent to collocate, and on each annual anniversary date thereafter.

**Sec. 106-108.** - **Abandonment.** A small wireless facility that is not operated for a continuous period of 12 months shall be considered abandoned. The owner of the facility shall remove the small wireless facility within 90 days after receipt of written notice from the City notifying the wireless provider of the abandonment.

The notice shall be sent by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, by the City to the owner at the last known address of the wireless provider. If the small wireless facility is not removed within 90 days of such notice, the City may remove or cause the removal of such facility pursuant to the terms of its pole attachment agreement for municipal utility poles or through whatever actions are provided for abatement of nuisances or by other law for removal and cost recovery.

A wireless provider shall provide written notice to the City if it sells or transfers small wireless facilities within the jurisdiction of the City. Such notice shall include the name and contact information of the new wireless provider.

**Sec. 106-109. - Dispute Resolution.** The Circuit Court of LaSalle County, Illinois shall have exclusive jurisdiction to resolve all disputes arising under the Small Wireless Facilities Deployment Act. Pending resolution of a dispute concerning rates for collocation of small wireless facilities on municipal utility poles within the right-of-way, the City shall allow the collocating person to collocate on its poles at annual rates of no more than \$200 per year per municipal utility pole, with rates to be determined upon final resolution of the dispute.

**Sec. 106-110. - Indemnification.** A wireless provider shall indemnify and hold the City harmless against any and all liability or loss from personal injury or property damage resulting from or arising out of, in whole or in part, the use or occupancy of the City improvements or right-of-way associated with such improvements by the wireless provider or its employees, agents, or contractors arising out of the rights and privileges granted under this Ordinance and the Act. A wireless provider has no obligation to indemnify or hold harmless against any liabilities and losses as may be due to or caused by the sole negligence of the City or its employees or agents. A wireless provider shall further waive any claims that they may have against the City with respect to consequential, incidental, or special damages, however caused, based on the theory of liability.

**Sec. 106-111. - Insurance.** The wireless provider shall carry, at the wireless provider's own cost and expense, the following insurance:

(i) property insurance for its property's replacement cost against all risks;

- (ii) workers' compensation insurance, as required by law; and
- (iii) commercial general liability insurance with respect to its activities on the City improvements or rights-of-way to afford minimum protection limits consistent with its requirements of other users of City improvements or rights-of-way, including coverage for bodily injury and property damage.

The wireless provider shall include the City as an additional insured on the commercial general liability policy and provide certification and documentation of inclusion of the City in a commercial general liability policy prior to the collocation of any wireless facility.

A wireless provider may self-insure all or a portion of the insurance coverage and limit requirement required by the City. A wireless provider that self-insures is not required, to the extent of the self-insurance, to comply with the requirement for the name of additional insureds under this Section. A wireless provider that elects to self-insure shall provide to the City evidence sufficient to demonstrate its financial ability to self-insure the insurance coverage limits required by the City.

**SECTION 5**: Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstances is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

**SECTION 6**: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage and approval according to law. This Ordinance shall be published in the City of Peru Code of Ordinances.
