While neon orange and green are not exactly the city colors, we've seen quite a bit of those two hues with the abundance of construction barrels, worker's safety apparel and detour signs occupying city streets in 2015. The inconveniences that go along with construction can be frustrating, though the upside is the updates that we will realize upon completion! Here's an update on some of the major infrastructure and maintenance projects taking place in our community:

Peoria Street Improvements – The total reconstruction of the existing water main and pavement from Shooting Park Road to the 8th Street intersection.

Area 1 Phase 3 Sewer Separation – The continuation of IEPA mandated sewer separation. The fourth year of a long-term planned project that will be completed in phases over the course of an estimated 15 years. This year's area encompassed Rock Street from Center Street to just south of 8th Street, Bluff Street from Plum Street to Rock Street, Plum Street from Bluff Street to 4th Street (US Rt. 6), and 5th Street from Rock Street to Plain Street.

MFT Program – This year's program focused on the resurfacing of Wenzel Road from Rt. 251 east to the city limits. Favorable bids allowed the use of additional MFT funds to complete the resurfacing of 36th Street from Route 251 west to N. Peoria Street. **State Street Water Main Loop** – Construction of water main in order to tie together two long dead end mains and provide better water circulation.

Farm House Demolition – The demolition of an old farmhouse and four barns on the city 's electrical building property.

General Fund Street Maintenance –

Resurfacing of various streets, including curb ramp construction, curb and gutter replacement and pavement markings.

Airport Parking Lot – Rehabilitation of the entrance road and the parking lot at the Illinois Valley Regional Airport.

Ash Tree Treatment/Removal – Treatment or removal of emerald ash borer-infested trees on city property.

Common **Questions**

Where can I pay my utility bill?

Bills can be paid in person and through the drive-up window at the City Clerk's Office at 1901 Fourth Street.

City of Peru bills can be paid electronically with a credit card or bank card using the new Peru online bill pay component on the city's website www.peru.il.us

A payment drop box is available next to the drive-up facility at the north end of the building.

Automatic withdrawal from your checking account can be initiated by visiting the Clerk's office.

Also, access to Illinois Funds E-Pay is available on the city's website.

My recycling, garbage, or yard waste was not picked up. Who can I call?

The city has a contract with Illinois Valley Waste Services, 815-875-2293. All garbage, recycling, and yard waste must be out by 6AM on your pickup day. Yard waste bags are picked up on Mondays only, beginning in April and ending in November. Yard waste must be in designated bags which may be purchased at the City Clerk's Office or participating merchants.

Can I leave large items out for garbage pickup?

Illinois Valley Waste Services will pick up one bulk item per week with regular garbage. Bulk item consists of a piece of furniture, mattress, or carpeting (cut into 2ft. lengths and tied). No appliances, electronics, building materials, or hazardous wastes are allowed. For additional information on garbage and recycling, visit www.peru.il.us

How do I report a water main break?

If you see a water main break, damaged fire hydrant, or any other problem with the City of Peru water system, please call the Public Works Department at 815-223-2962 from 7AM-3:30PM, M-F, or contact the non-emergency line of the Police Department at 815-223-2151, 24 hours a day.

How do I report a pothole?

Please call the Public Works Department at 815-223-2962 from 7AM-3:30PM, M-F.

General Park Rules

- Park hours are 6:00 AM to 10:00 PM.
- Shelters at Washington Park, Centennial Park, and Baker Lake may be reserved by Peru residents, clubs, organizations and businesses or a property owner of real estate located within the corporate limits of the City of Peru. Reservations must be made in person at the Police Department. Must bring a photo ID. Shelters cannot be reserved over the phone.
- If you would like to hold an event at any park, please contact the City Clerk.
- Alcohol for personal consumption is allowed only within the shelter area and must be in compliance with all state and city regulations. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages may be sold in the park.
- Dogs are only allowed at Wiggly Park.

Peru ranked fifth best in Illinois for businesses

Is Peru a good place for companies to do business? One financial news service has decided so.

Nerdwallet looked at 285 Illinois communities with populations of 5,000 or more and analyzed each using data from the U.S. Census Bureau. Nerdwallet then named its top business-friendly cities and put Peru in its Top 5.

"Peru is the only city in the top 10 outside of the Chicago area – about 100 miles from the Windy City," Nerdwallet's Jonathan Todd wrote in a June 2 posting. "Since it's far from Chicago, housing is the most affordable of our top 10 places (the median monthly housing cost is \$702). Peru also has the largest number of businesses with paid employees (61 percent)."

Todd said the study showed the state's most attractive communities were small in population - except for No. 7 Elk Grove Village, most cities were under 20,000 - and located close to Chicago.

"New business prospects we market the city of Peru to and end up working with expect a certain level of professionalism and immediate response," said Bob Vickrey, director of economic development for the City of Peru.

"The city council members and the economic development team at Peru City Hall work to exceed those expectations," he said, "and when we do we pass through a vital psychological doorway wherein we gain the confidence of the prospect and a seat at the decision making table."

Scott Stavrakas, president of the Illinois Valley Area Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development, congratulated

Peru and said the ranking reflects the growing prestige Peru enjoys in Chicago-land, where IVAC has heavily promoted this region.

"Peru is one of our main selling points when we are presenting the area. Their leaders have done an incredible job of working with their current business clients and recruiting new clients to the region," Stavrakas said.
